INTRODUCTION

- 1 This paper provides an update from Statistics and Clinical Studies and summarises recent presentations, publications, and current and future work in the area of pancreas transplantation.

UPDATE FROM STATISTICS AND CLINICAL STUDIES

- 2 The *Organ Donation and Transplantation Annual Activity Report for 2016/17* was published in July 2017, reporting a total of 4,753 live-saving and life-transforming transplants last financial year. - 3 New and updated reports, all Advisory Group papers and conference presentations continue to be posted on the new ODT Clinical Site www.odt.nhs.uk. The 2017 Annual Reports for all organs have now been published. All reports incorporate feedback from the Organ Specific Annual Reports Survey which was conducted earlier this year.
- 4 In June we said farewell to Professor Dave Collett after 14 years as head of the department. Rachel Johnson has been appointed as Dave's successor.

PRESENTATIONS

- 6 Three presentations were given at IPITA in Oxford in June on pancreas transplantation, islet transplantation and the National Pancreas Allocation Scheme.

CURRENT AND FUTURE WORK

- 7 Work on an Interim Annual Report on Pancreas and Islet Transplantation between April 2017 and September 2017 is due to commence shortly and will be published later this year.
- 8 A prospective data collection for the Post Islet Transplant Sensitisation Study is on-going. Data collection will be reviewed by the PAG Islet Steering Group.
- 9 We continue to monitor the National Pancreas Allocation Scheme to make sure that no patient groups are being disadvantaged.
- 10 Work will be on-going to support three of the four working groups introduced by PAG; Organ allocation, Organ utilisation and damage, Donor and Recipient Risk Analysis.
- 11 An extensive collaboration with UKITC has enabled validation of key data items on the islet transplantation data held by both NHSBT and UKITC.
