

# **Midlands Organ Donation Services Team**

## Taking Organ Transplantation to 2020

In 2017/18, from 249 consented donors the Midlands Organ Donation Services Team facilitated 174 actual solid organ donors resulting in 459 patients receiving a life-saving or life-changing transplant.

In addition to the 174 proceeding donors there were 75 additional consented donors that did not proceed.


#### Best quality of care in organ donation


#### Referral of potential deceased organ donors

Goal: Every patient who meets the referral criteria should be identified and referred to NHS Blood and Transplant's Organ Donation Service

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart







816 potential organ donors were referred to the team during 2017/18. There were 168 occasions where potential organ donors were not referred.

When compared with UK performance, the performance within the Trusts in the team was poor (red) for referral of potential organ donors to NHS Blood and Transplant.




#### **Presence of Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation**

Goal: A Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation (SNOD) should be present during every organ donation discussion with families

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold



A SNOD was present for 332 organ donation discussions with families during 2017/18. There were 54 occasions where a SNOD was not present.

When compared with UK performance, the performance within the Trusts in the team was below average (amber) for SNOD presence when approaching families to discuss organ donation.
