

# **South Wales Organ Donation Services Team**

## Taking Organ Transplantation to 2020

In 2017/18, from 98 consented donors the South Wales Organ Donation Services Team facilitated 62 actual solid organ donors resulting in 161 patients receiving a life-saving or life-changing transplant.

In addition to the 62 proceeding donors there were 36 additional consented donors that did not proceed.


#### Best quality of care in organ donation


#### Referral of potential deceased organ donors

Goal: Every patient who meets the referral criteria should be identified and referred to NHS Blood and Transplant's Organ Donation Service

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart







295 potential organ donors were referred to the team during 2017/18. There were 27 occasions where potential organ donors were not referred.

When compared with UK performance, the performance within the Health Boards in the team was average (bronze) for referral of potential organ donors to NHS Blood and Transplant.




#### **Presence of Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation**

Goal: A Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation (SNOD) should be present during every organ donation discussion with families

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold



A SNOD was present for 117 organ donation discussions with families during 2017/18. There were 12 occasions where a SNOD was not present.

When compared with UK performance, the performance within the Health Boards in the team was average (bronze) for SNOD presence when approaching families to discuss organ donation.
