

## Yorkshire Organ Donation Services Team

### Taking Organ Transplantation to 2020

In 2017/18, from 209 consented donors the Yorkshire Organ Donation Services Team facilitated 144 actual solid organ donors resulting in 399 patients receiving a life-saving or life-changing transplant.

In addition to the 144 proceeding donors there were 65 additional consented donors that did not proceed.

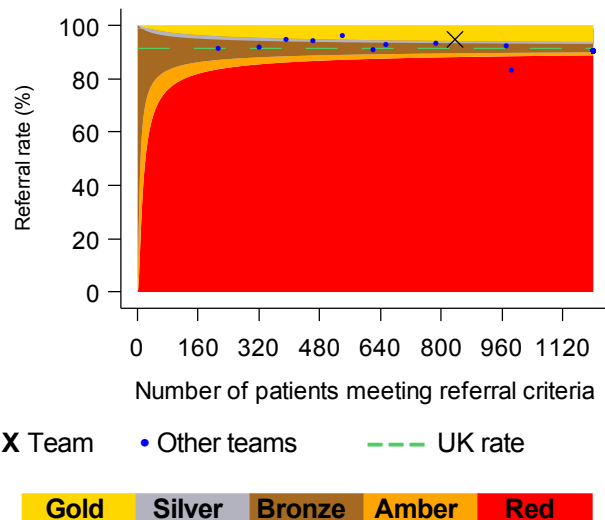
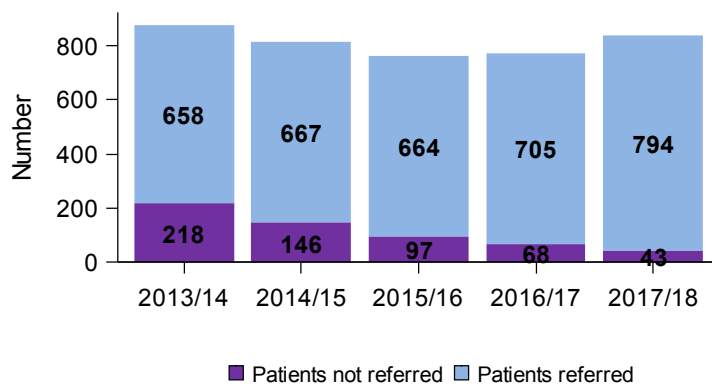
### Best quality of care in organ donation

#### Referral of potential deceased organ donors

**Goal: Every patient who meets the referral criteria should be identified and referred to NHS Blood and Transplant's Organ Donation Service**

**Aim: There should be no purple on the chart**

**Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold**



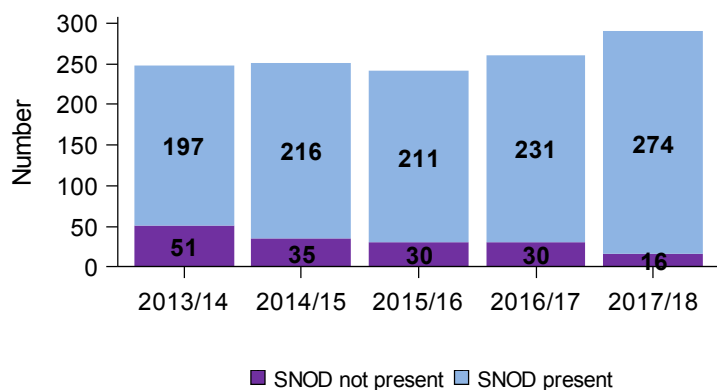
794 potential organ donors were referred to the team during 2017/18. There were 43 occasions where potential organ donors were not referred.

When compared with UK performance, the performance within the Trusts in the team was exceptional (gold) for referral of potential organ donors to NHS Blood and Transplant.

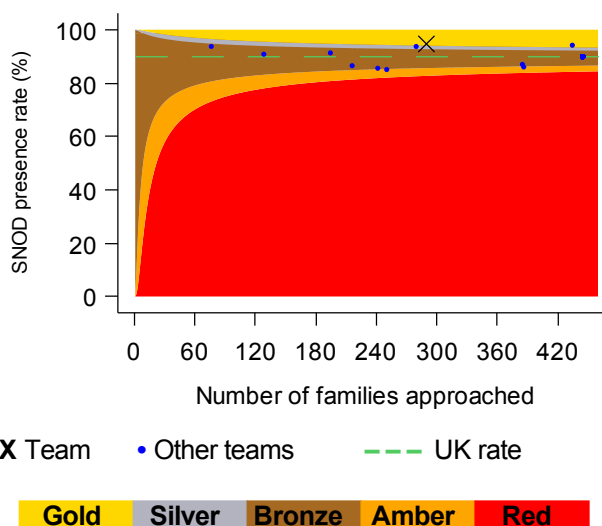
## Presence of Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation

**Goal: A Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation (SNOD) should be present during every organ donation discussion with families**

**Aim: There should be no purple on the chart**



**Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold**



A SNOD was present for 274 organ donation discussions with families during 2017/18. There were 16 occasions where a SNOD was not present.

When compared with UK performance, the performance within the Trusts in the team was exceptional (gold) for SNOD presence when approaching families to discuss organ donation.

<sup>1</sup> DBD - A patient with suspected neurological death  
DCD - A patient in whom imminent death is anticipated, ie a patient receiving assisted ventilation, a clinical decision to withdraw treatment has been made and death is anticipated within 4 hours

<sup>2</sup> DBD - Death confirmed by neurological tests and no absolute contraindications to solid organ donation  
DCD - Imminent death anticipated and treatment withdrawn with no absolute contraindications to solid organ donation

Note that a patient that meets both the referral criteria for DBD and DCD organ donation is featured in both the DBD and DCD data but will only be counted once in the deceased donors total
