## **LESSONS LEARNT**

The following needs have been identified to support the implementation of a Pre-op Anaemia Programme:

- Collect the learning from each pilot site as well as the successes
- Focus on the patient experience, use patient stories and voices to understand their journey
- Provide patient information literature
- Already implemented in Blackpool- the patient carries with them a form of secondary information and an audit form is attached on the front of their notes. Although the numbers of patients is reduced due to the self-funding nature of their pilot and waiting list has decreased as short as one week, their pilot will give data and allow them to sell the project further afield.

### **Primary Care**

- Work closely with primary care to define the role of GPs in anaemia diagnosis and management
- Build an integrated service for GPs and in-patients as well as primary care management of anaemia
- Raise awareness in GP anaemia management
- Joint collaboration between primary and secondary care
- Understand the importance of cultural awareness

### Performance Monitoring

- Have clear measurements in place to collect data
- Ascertain what data can be collected electronically.
- Collect information on every patient who goes through the pre-operative anaemia pathway who has active management
- Identify measurement outcomes at the outset and measure the benefits to the patient
- Importance of all pilots to be monitoring the same data as this facilitates learning

#### Accountability

- Have someone accountable to oversee the project, a 'Champion', for example a Consultant Anaesthetist or Nurse Practitioner or other person suitably qualified
- Agree roles and responsibilities at the outset

# Empower staff

• Empower laboratory staff to flag up issues re inappropriate use of blood as part of their learning
