

# **South East Organ Donation Services Team**

## Taking Organ Transplantation to 2020

In 2018/19, from 199 consented donors the South East Organ Donation Services Team facilitated 142 actual solid organ donors resulting in 332 patients receiving a life-saving or life-changing transplant. Data obtained from the UK Transplant Registry.

In addition to the 142 proceeding donors there were 57 consented donors that did not proceed.


### Best quality of care in organ donation


### Referral of potential deceased organ donors

Goal: Every patient who meets the referral criteria should be identified and referred to NHS Blood and Transplant's Organ Donation Service

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart







670 potential organ donors were referred to the team during 2018/19. There were 31 occasions where potential organ donors were not referred.

When compared with UK performance, the performance within the Trusts in the team was average (bronze) for referral of potential organ donors to NHS Blood and Transplant.




### **Presence of Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation**

Goal: A Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation (SNOD) should be present during every organ donation discussion with families

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold



A SNOD was present for 250 organ donation discussions with families during 2018/19. There were 31 occasions where a SNOD was not present.

When compared with UK performance, the performance within the Trusts in the team was average (bronze) for SNOD presence when approaching families to discuss organ donation.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> DBD - A patient with suspected neurological death

DCD - A patient in whom imminent death is anticipated, ie a patient receiving assisted ventilation, a clinical decision to withdraw treatment has been made and death is anticipated within 4 hours

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> DBD - Death confirmed by neurological tests and no absolute contraindications to solid organ donation

DCD - Imminent death anticipated and treatment withdrawn with no absolute contraindications to solid organ donation
