1 New Liver Offering Scheme

- 1.1 J Monroe thanked everyone for joining the telecon the purpose of which was to allow Accountable Members to see and discuss with the Chair of the Liver Advisory Group the final versions of the following policies:
 - Liver Transplantation: Selection Criteria and Recipient Registration
 - Deceased Donor Liver Distribution and Allocation

The principles of the changes to the liver offering scheme were previously approved by TPRC and were due to come into effect in spring 2018.

Discussion points:

Liver Transplantation: Selection Criteria and Recipient Registration

- Agreed to remove references to the closure of the service development evaluations to transplant patients with severe acute alcoholic hepatitis and with sickle cell hepatopathy.
- Donor type and virology: Amend to read that these questions default to 'no' on both the registration and sequential data update forms

Post meeting note: This has now been amended to read "The donor type questions default to 'yes' on both the registration and sequential data update forms whilst the donor virology questions default to 'null' (subject to I.T. change) on both the registration and sequential data update forms.
