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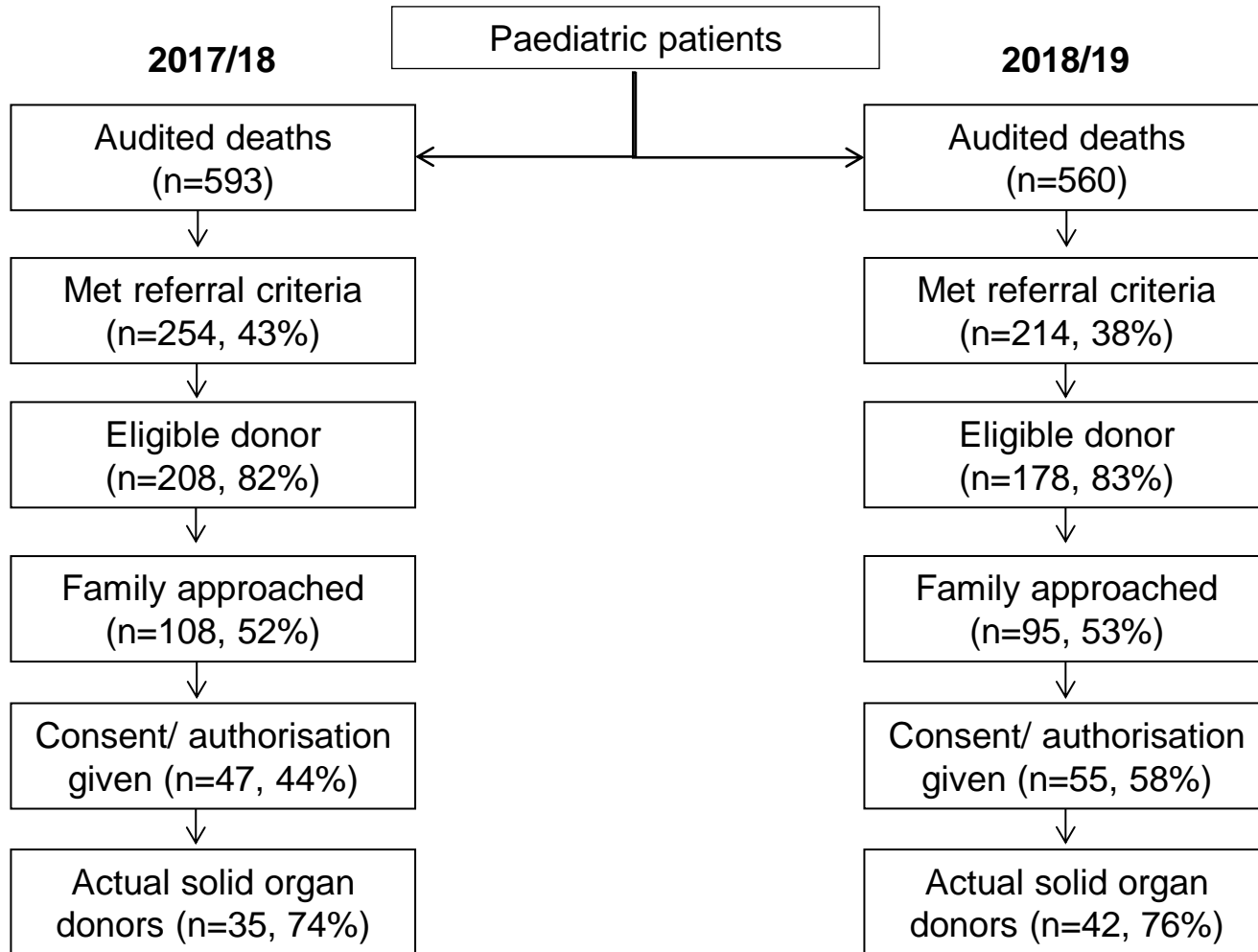

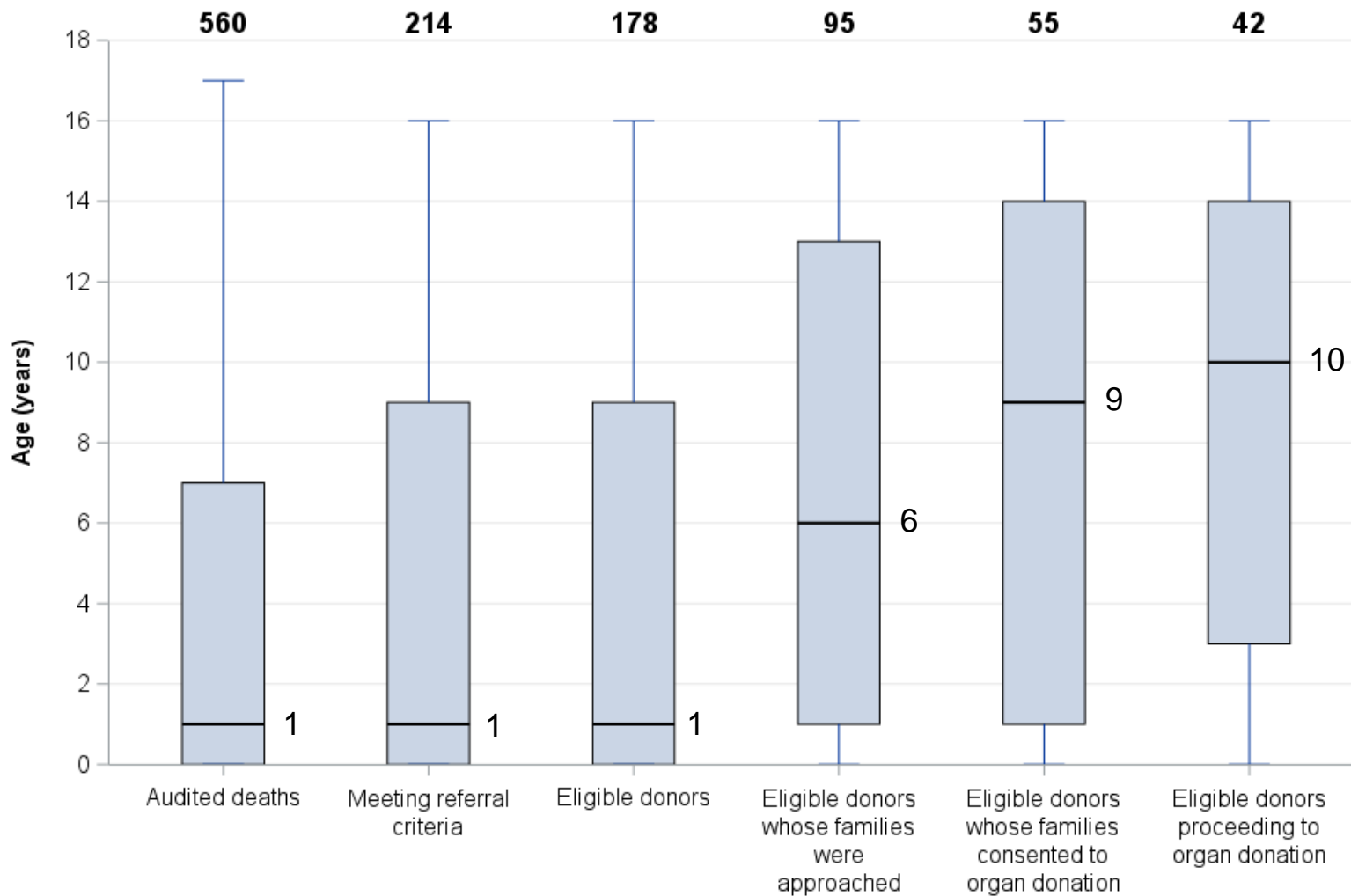

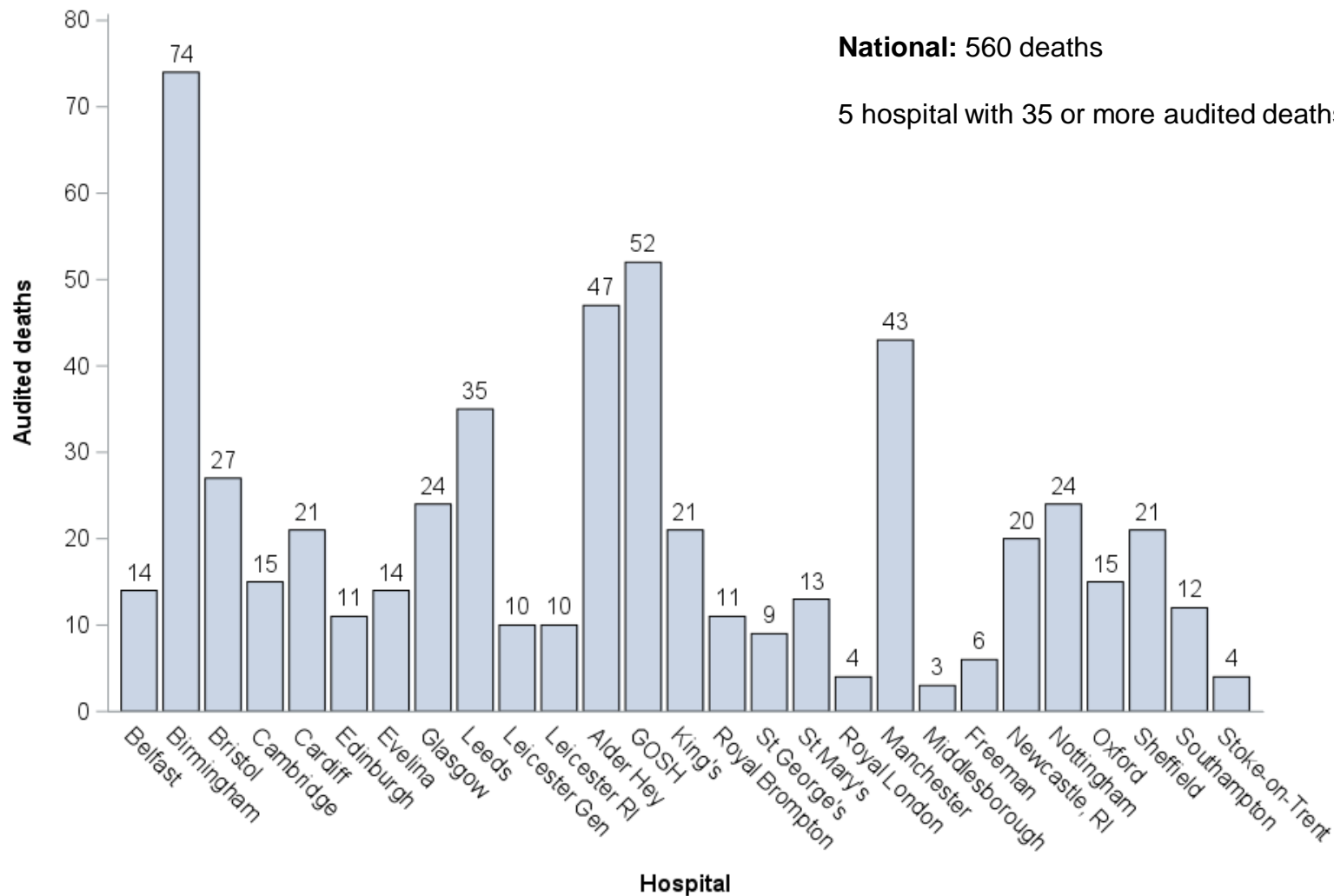
# Flow of paediatric patients through the donation pathway (PDA data)



# Age distribution, April 2018 – March 2019



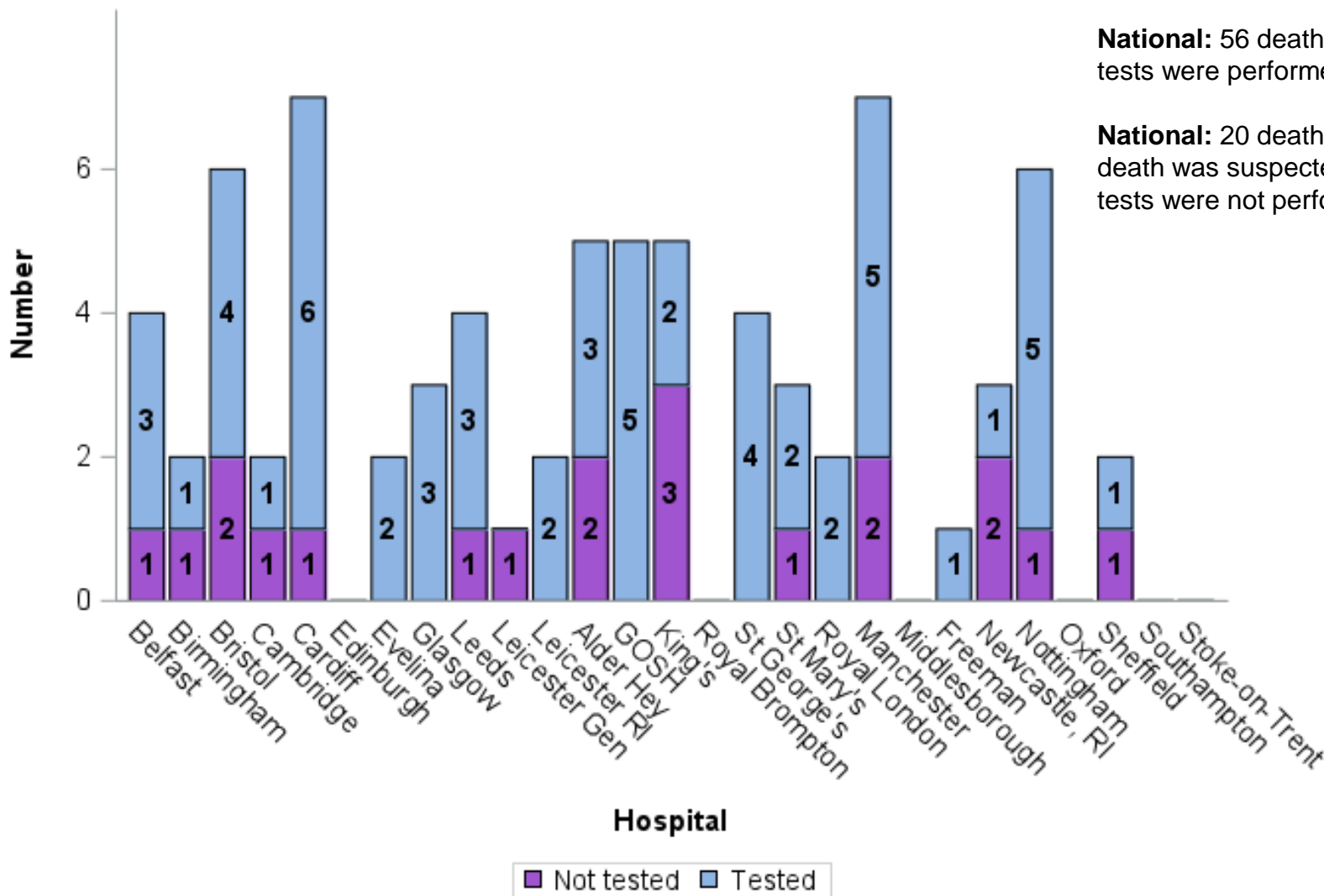
# Audited deaths by hospital, April 2018 – March 2019



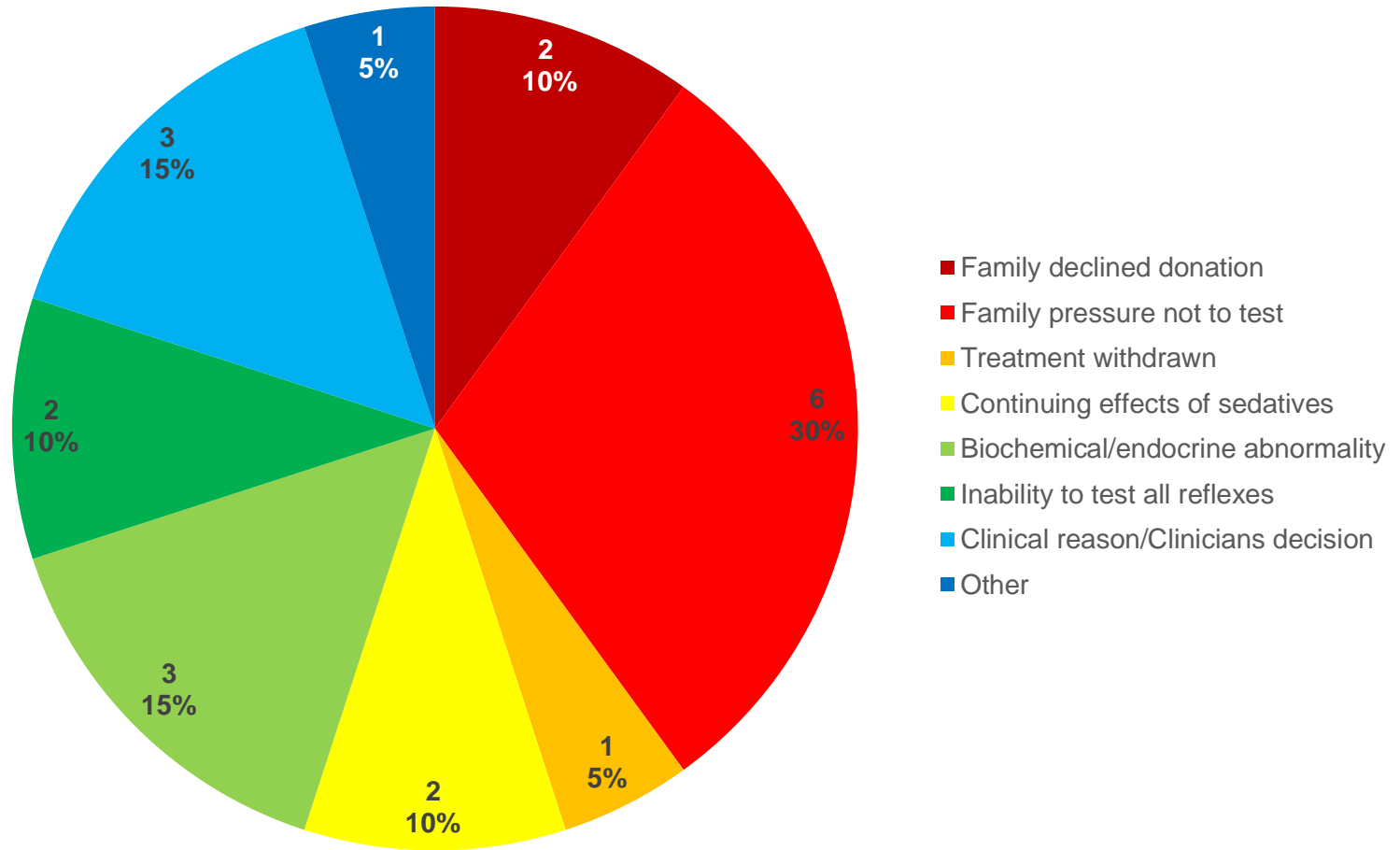
# Number of neurological death tested/not tested patients by hospital, April 2018 – March 2019

**National:** 56 deaths where neurological tests were performed.

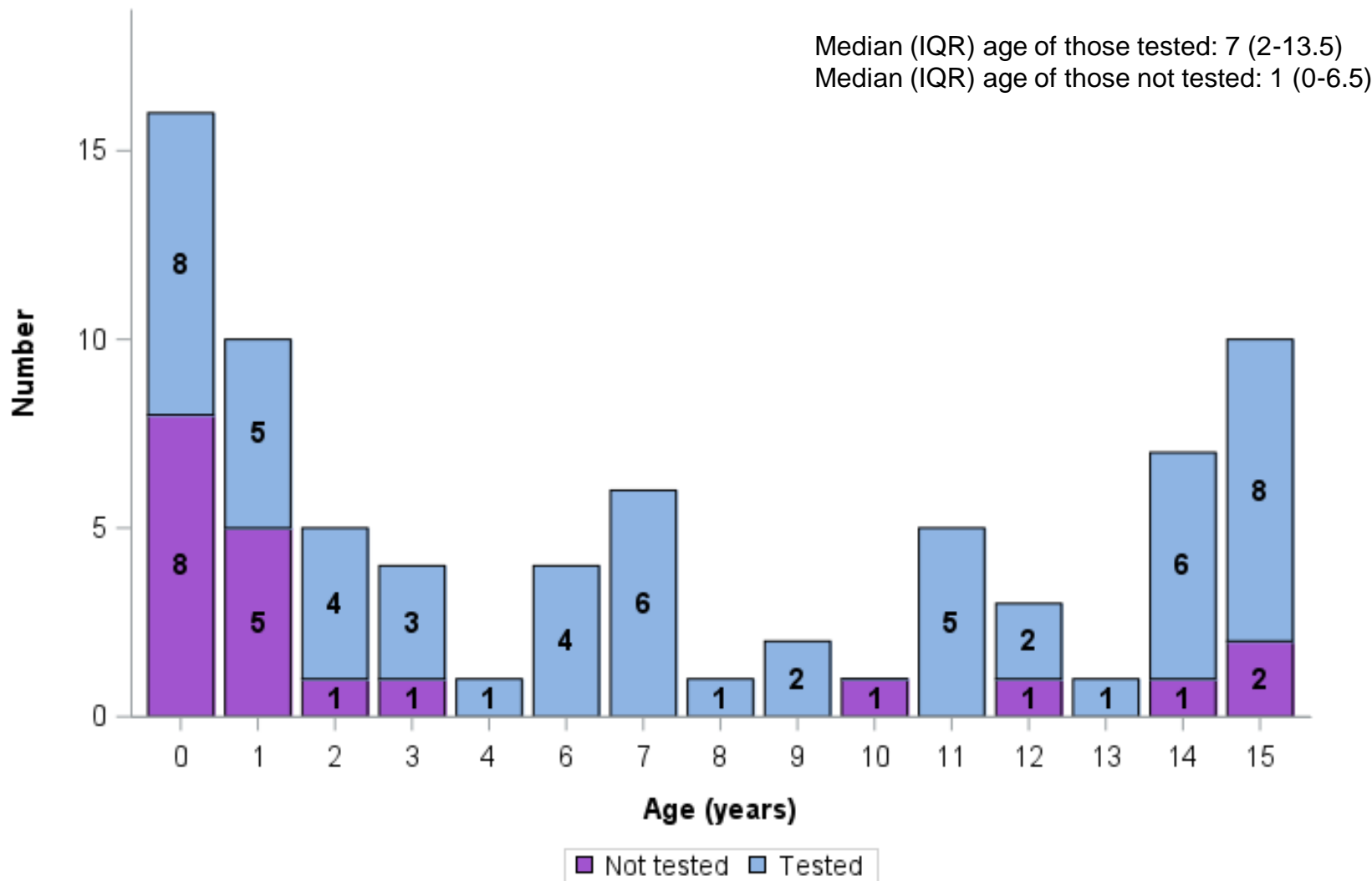
**National:** 20 deaths where neurological death was suspected and neurological tests were not performed.



# Reason why neurological death tests were not performed, April 2018 – March 2019

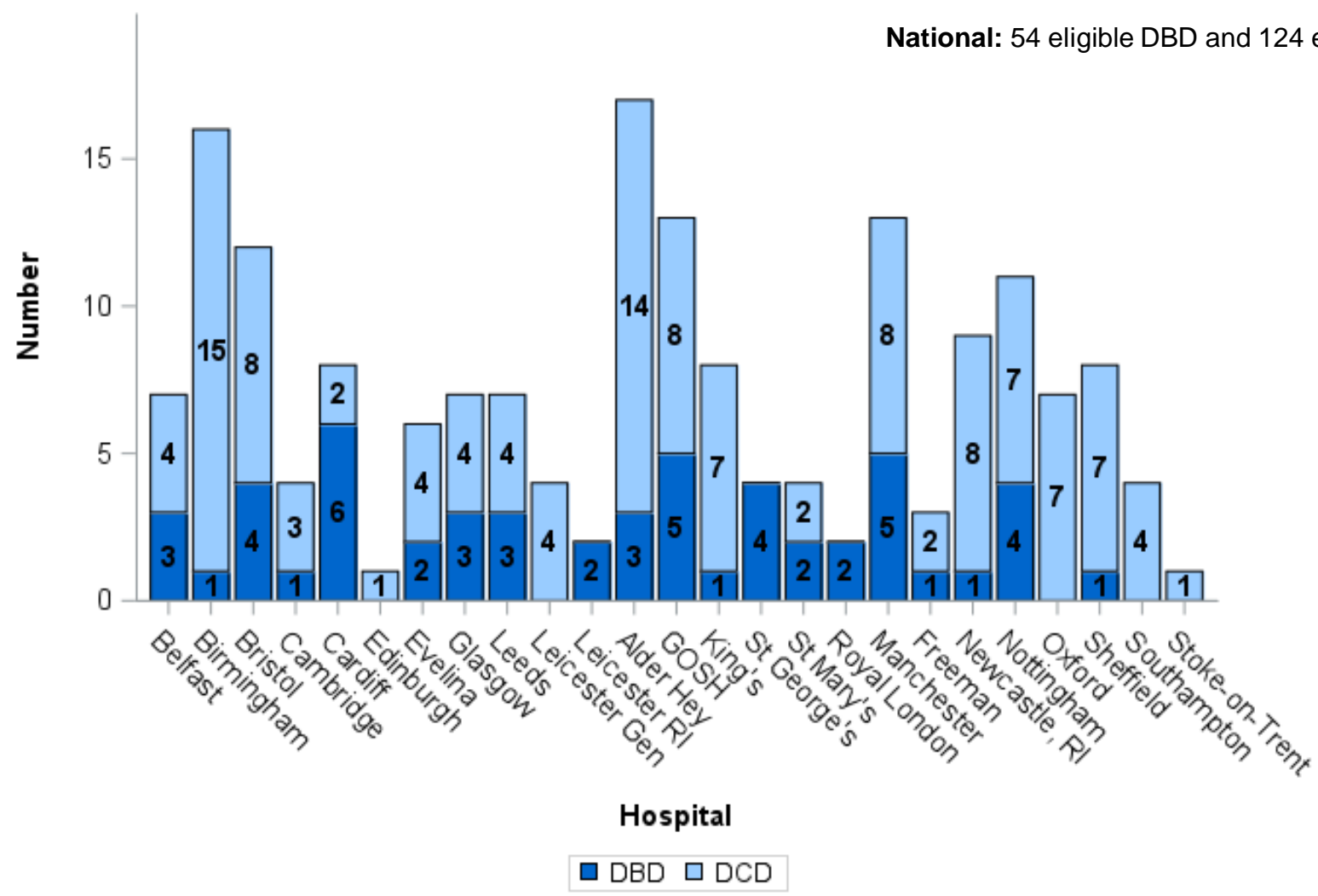


# Neurological death tests performed by age, April 2018 – March 2019



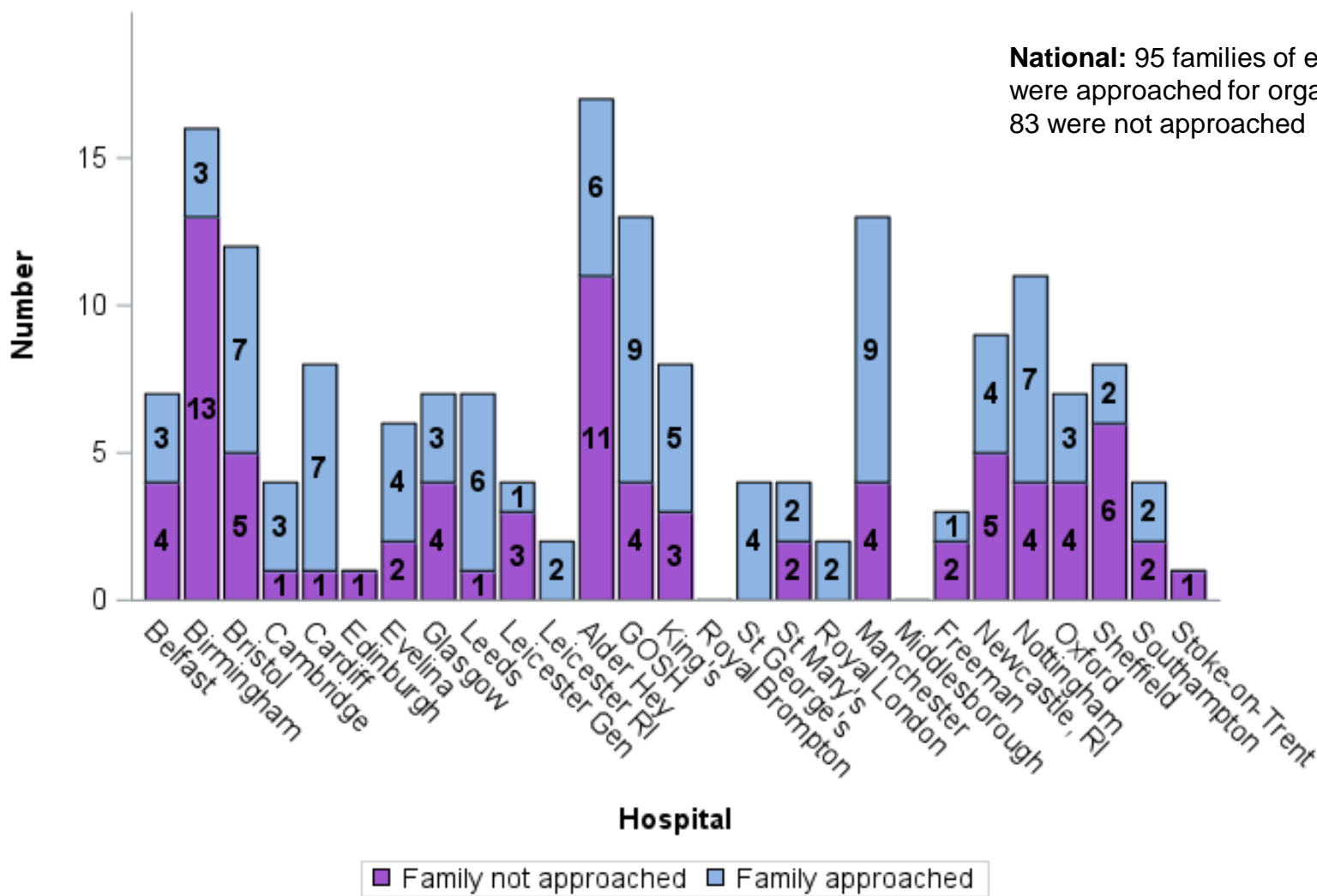
# Eligible donors by hospital, April 2018 – March 2019

National: 54 eligible DBD and 124 eligible DCD donors

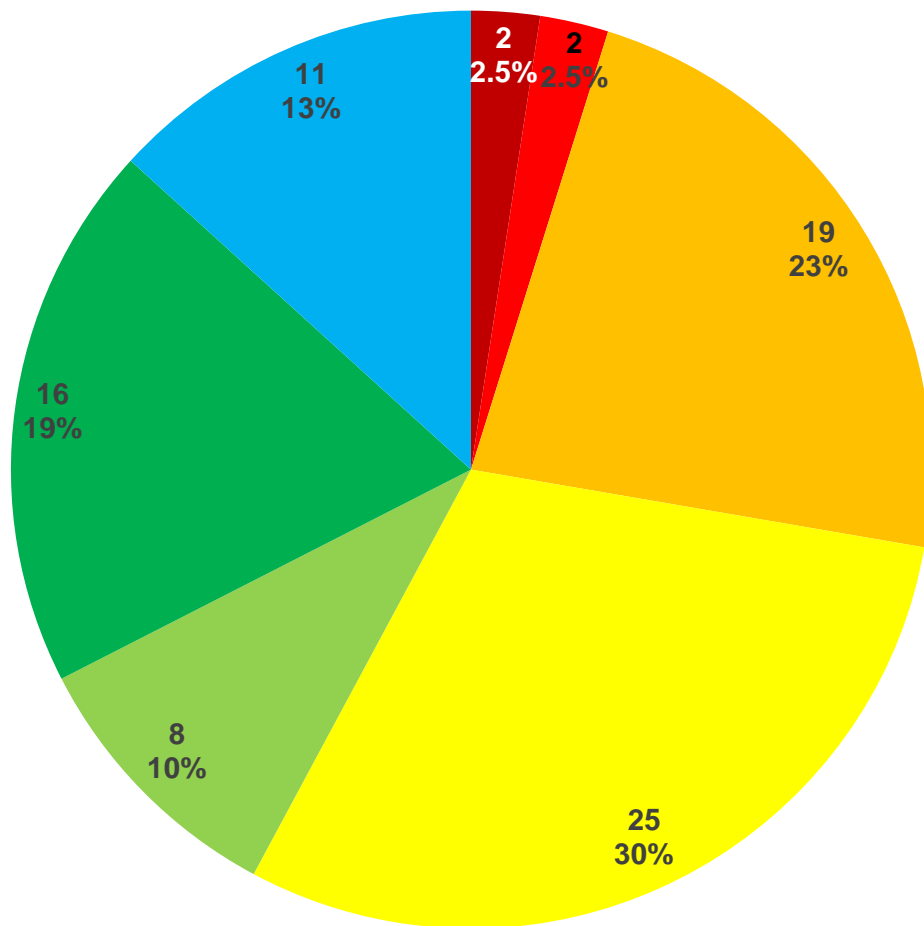




# Eligible donors by hospital and whether the family were approached, April 2018 – March 2019



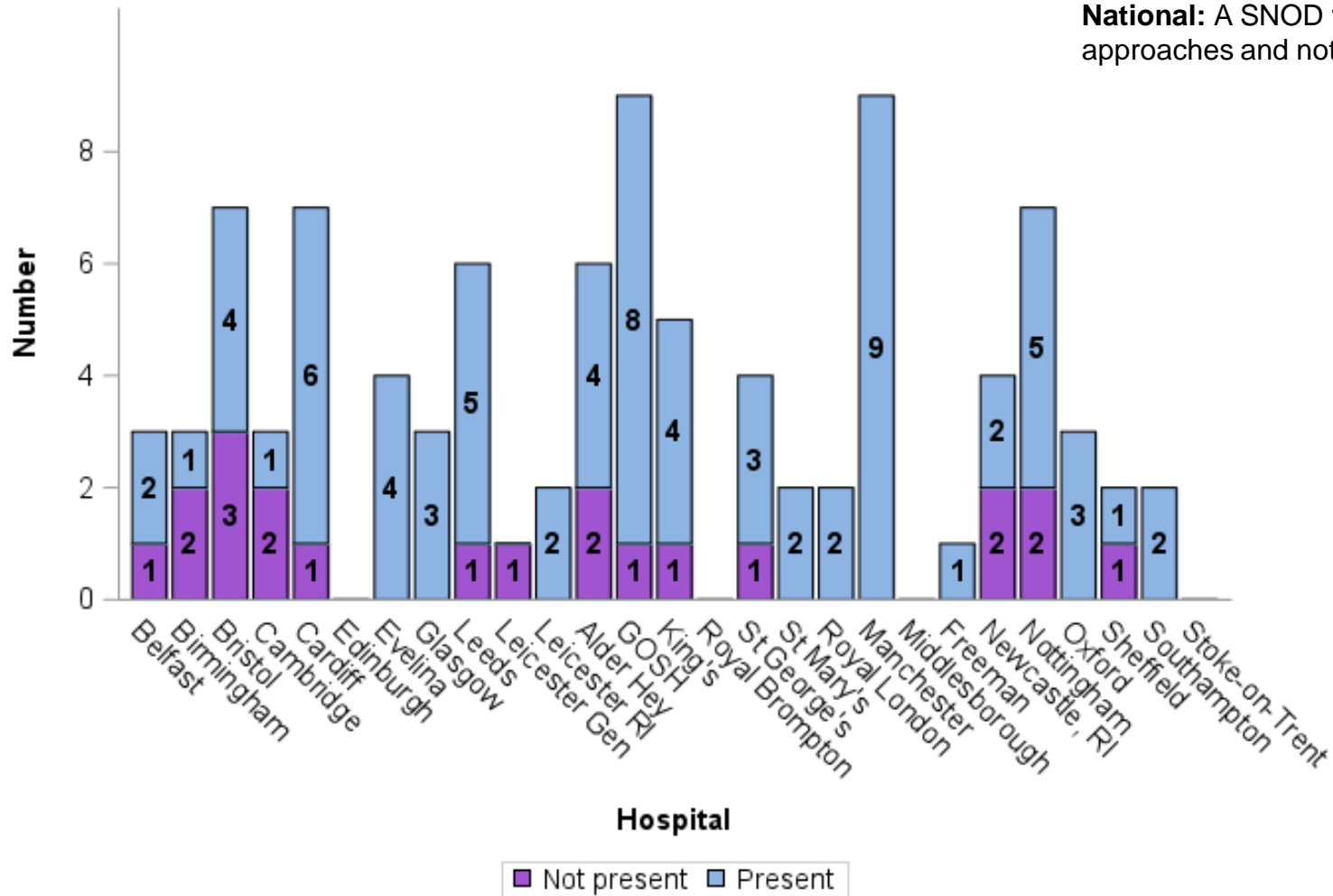
# Reason families of eligible donors were not approached, April 2018 – March 2019

- Not identified as a potential donor/organ donation not considered

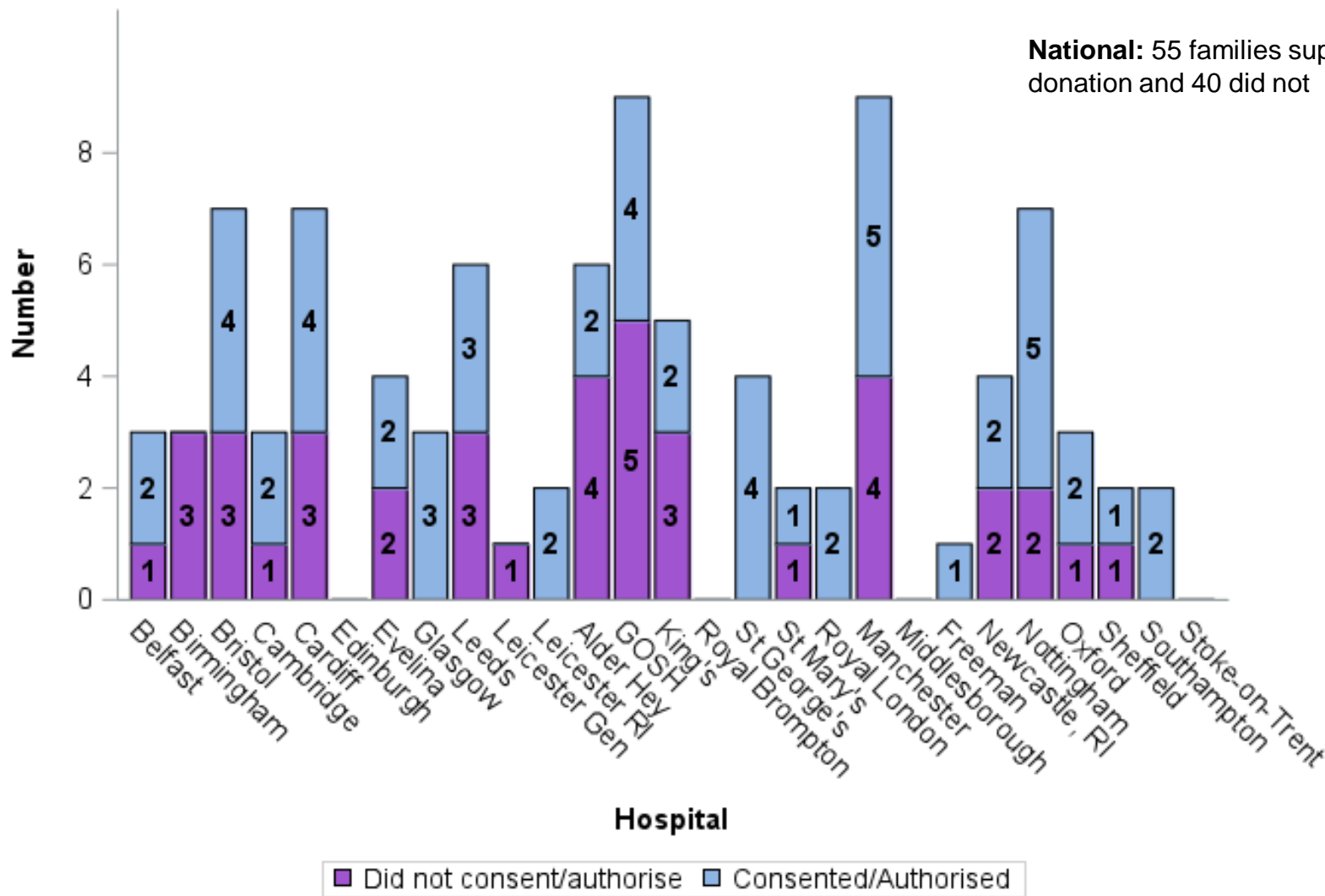
# Number of approaches where a SNOD was present/not present by hospital, April 2018 – March 2019

**National:** A SNOD was present in 74 approaches and not present in 21

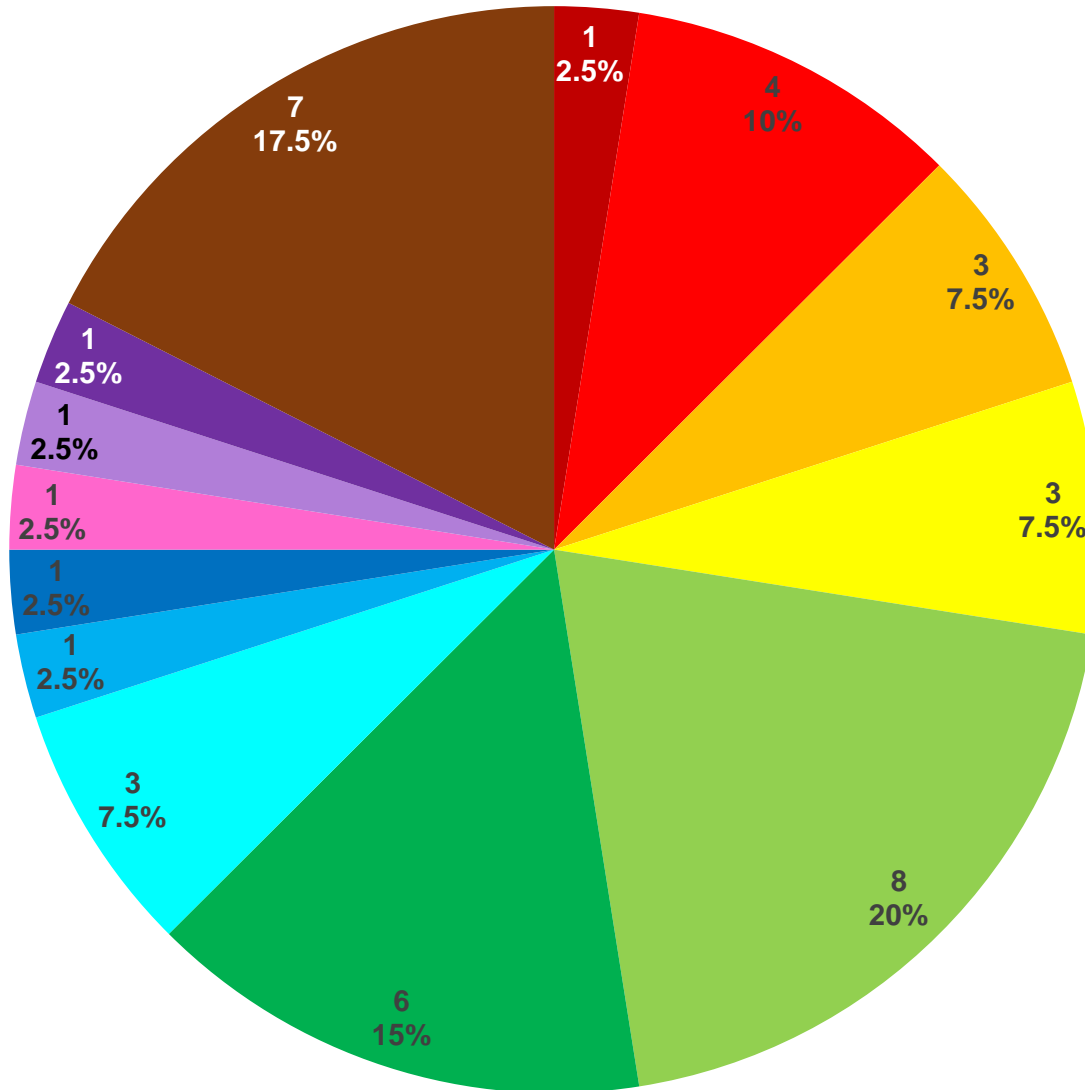


# Number of families consented/authorised organ donation by hospital, April 2018 – March 2019

**National:** 55 families supported organ donation and 40 did not



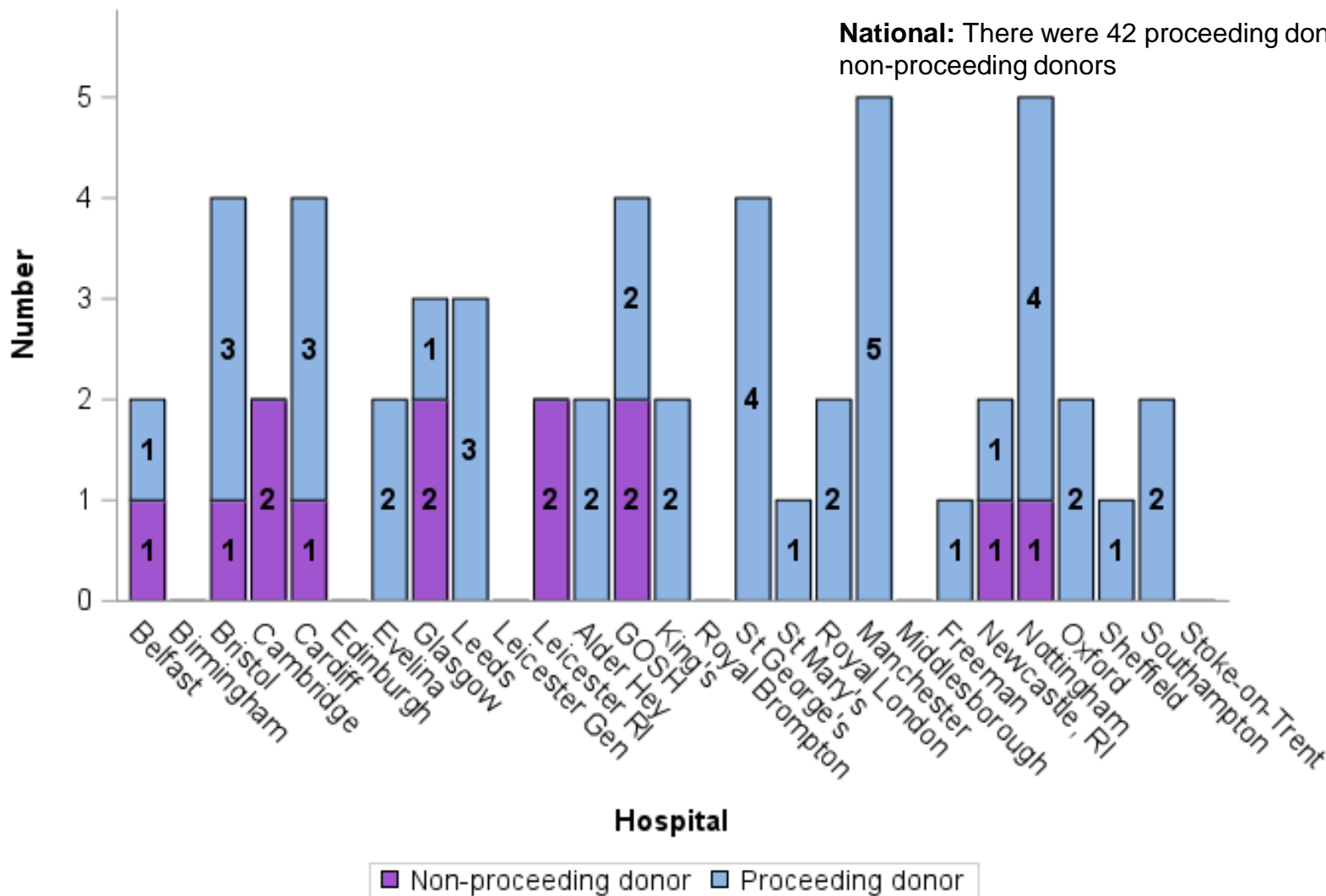
# Reason families of eligible donors did not support organ donation, April 2018 – March 2019



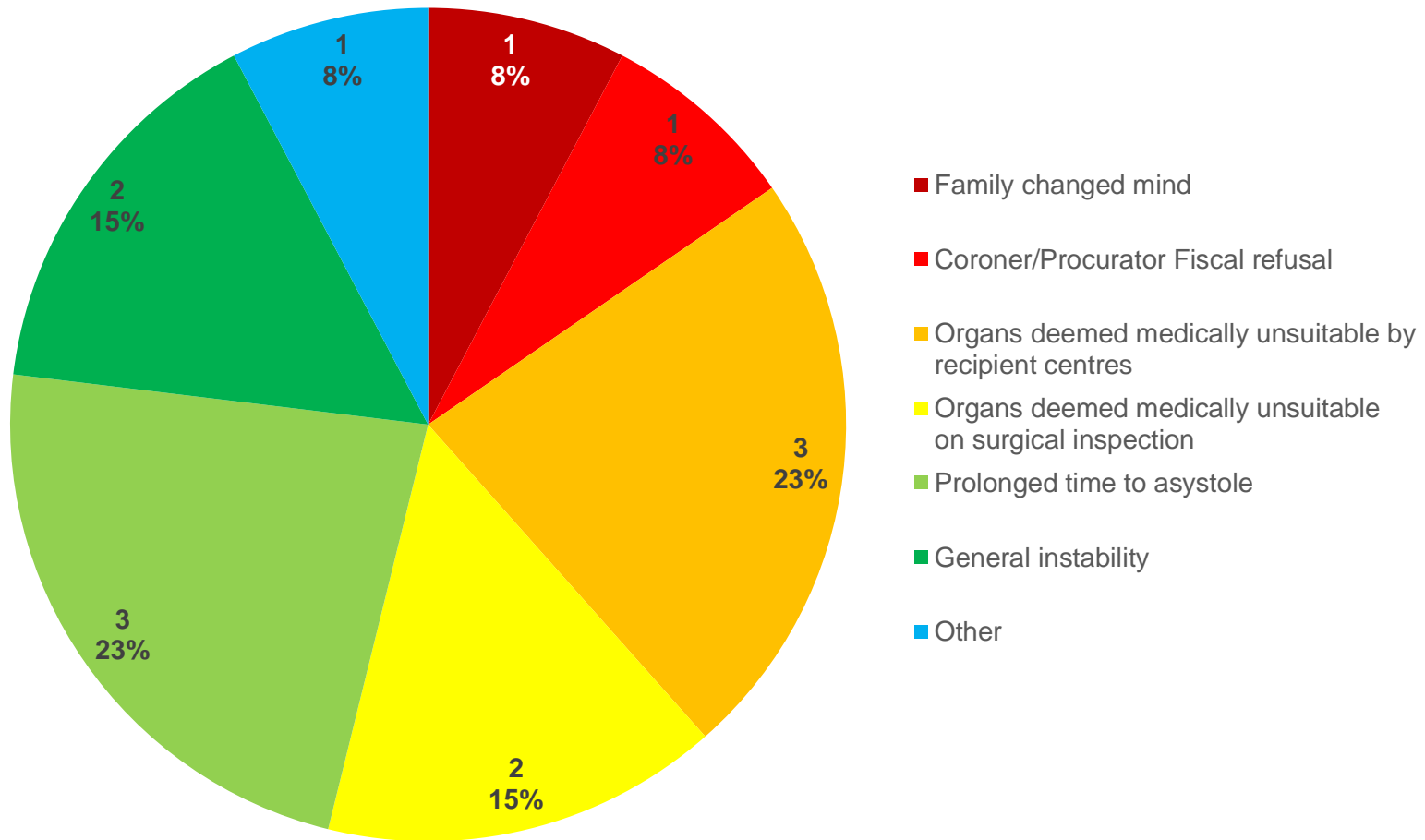
- Family were not sure whether the patient would have agreed to donation
- Family did not believe in donation
- Family felt it was against their religious/cultural beliefs
- Family were divided over the decision
- Family felt the patient had suffered enough
- Family did not want surgery to the body
- Family wanted to stay with the patient after death
- Family felt the length of time for donation process was too long
- Family concerned that other people may disapprove/be offended
- Family felt the body needs to be buried whole (unrelated to religious or cultural reasons)
- Family concerned that organs may not be transplanted
- Strong refusal - probing not appropriate
- Other

# Number of proceeding/non-proceeding donors by hospital, April 2018 – March 2019

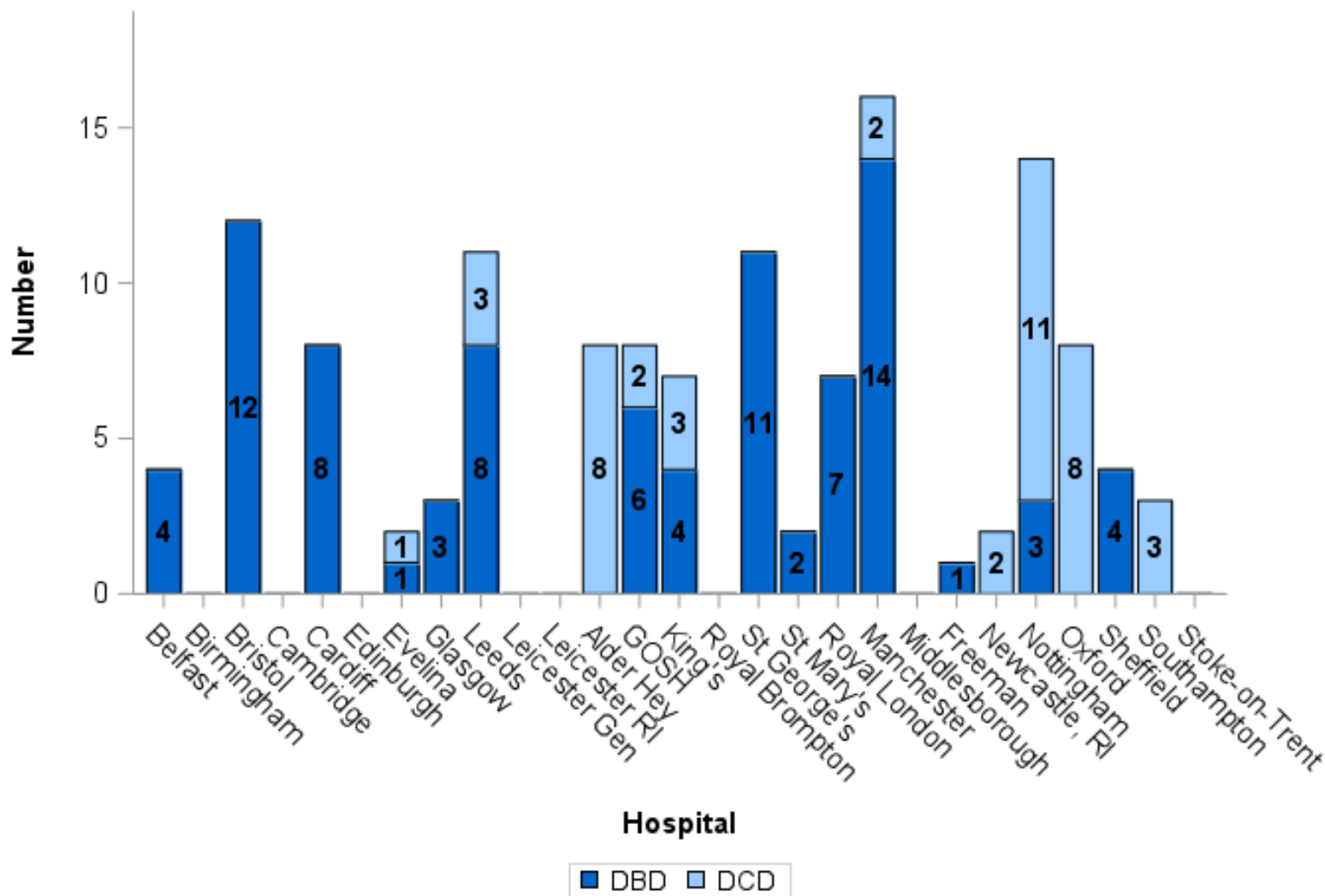
**National:** There were 42 proceeding donors and 13 non-proceeding donors

# Transplants from proceeding donors by hospital, April 2018 – March 2019



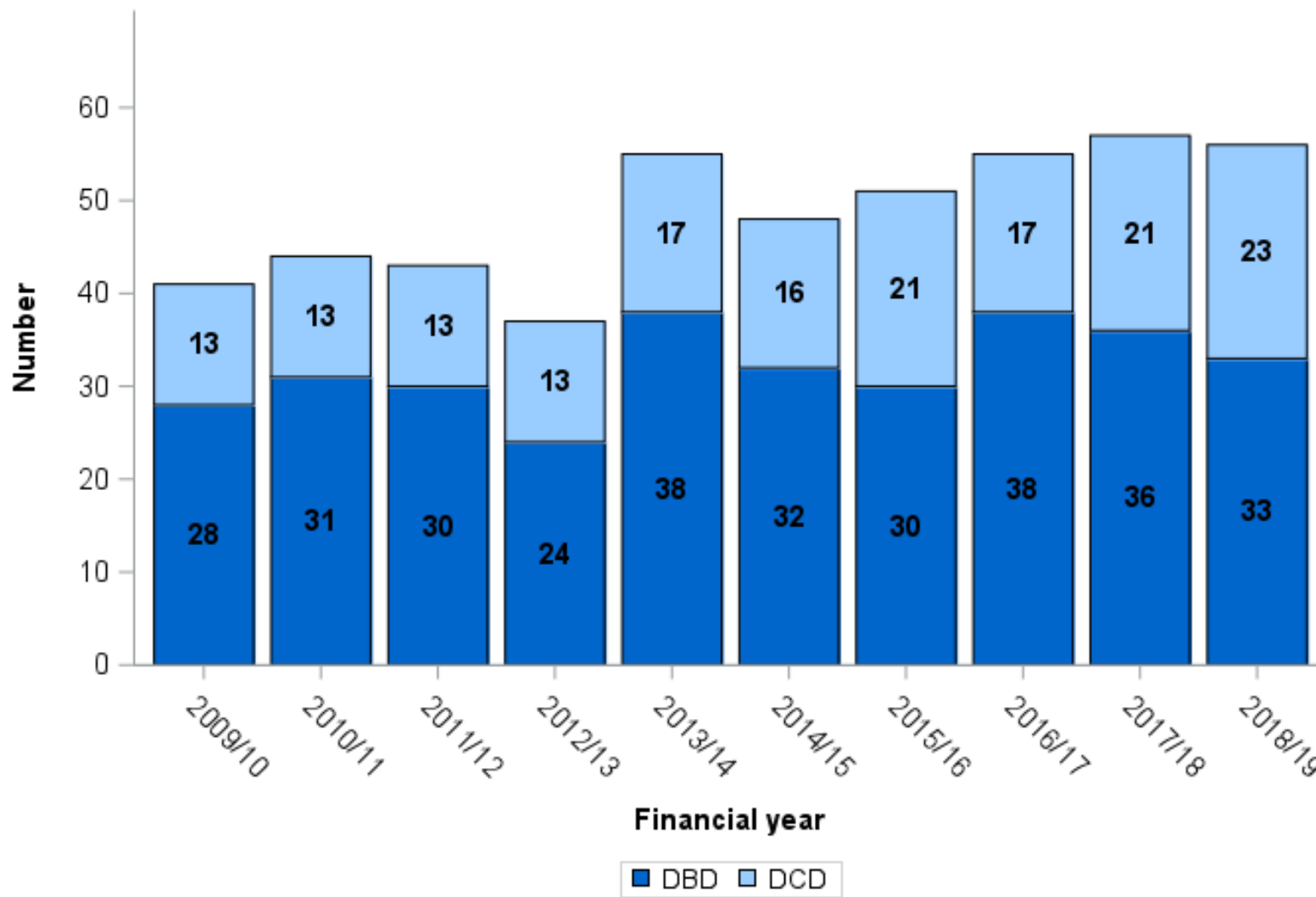
