**GROUP 2 AND NON-UK RESIDENT EU GROUP 1 PATIENT
TRANSPLANTS**

SUMMARY

BACKGROUND

- 1 This paper reports on a) intestinal transplants performed in Group 2 patients and b) intestinal transplants performed in Group 1 non-UK resident EU patients, between 1 January 2007 and 31 August 2017.

METHODS

- 2 Data on all Group 2 patients and all Group 1 non-UK resident EU patients who received an intestinal transplant in the UK between 1 January 2007 and 31 August 2017 were obtained from the UK Transplant Registry (UKTR) as recorded on 11 September 2017.

RESULTS

Group 2 patients

- 3 There were 4 Group 2 intestinal transplants performed in the UK between 1 January 2007 and 31 August 2017, all in paediatric patients and all received bowel-only transplants.

Group 1 non-UK resident EU patients

- 4 There were 5 Group 1 non-UK resident EU patient intestinal transplants performed in the UK between 1 January 2007 and 31 August 2017, three in paediatric patients and two in adult patients. One adult patient received a multivisceral transplant and the other a modified multivisceral transplant. Of the three paediatric patients, one received a bowel only transplant, one a liver, bowel and pancreas transplant and one a modified multivisceral transplant.

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RESULTS

Group 2 transplants

- 3 **Table 1** summarises Group 2 intestinal transplants by transplant centre and transplant type and year from 1 January 2007 and 31 August 2017. All Group 2 patients were listed as elective patients.

- 4 There were 4 Group 2 intestinal transplants performed in the UK between 1 January 2007 and 31 August 2017. All of these patients were paediatrics who received bowel only transplants.
- 5 The permanent country of residence, recorded on the UKTR, for these patients were New Zealand (1), Oman (1), Turkey (1) and UK (1).

- 7 Further information regarding the offering sequence leading to the Group 2 transplants, as recorded on the UKTR, is provided in **Table 2 (removed as patient identifiable)**. **Appendix II (removed as patient identifiable)** contains details relating to the four donors concerned.

Group 1 non-UK resident EU patient transplants

- 8 **Table 3** summarises Group 1 transplants for non-UK resident EU patients by transplant centre, transplant type and year from 1 January 2007 and 31 August 2017. All Group 1 non-UK resident EU patients were listed as elective patients.

- 9 There were 5 Group 1 non-UK resident EU patient intestinal transplants performed in the UK between 1 January 2007 and 31 August 2017.
- 10 Of the two adult non-UK resident EU Group 1 patients, one received a multivisceral transplant and the other a modified multivisceral transplant. Of the three paediatric non-UK resident EU Group 1 patients, one received a bowel only transplant, one a liver, bowel and pancreas transplant and one a modified multivisceral transplant.
- 11 The permanent country of residence, recorded on the UKTR, for the three paediatric Group 1 non-UK resident EU patients was Denmark (1), Germany (1) and Republic of Ireland (1). The permanent country of residence for the two adult Group 1 non-UK resident EU patients was Denmark (1) and Republic of Ireland (1).
