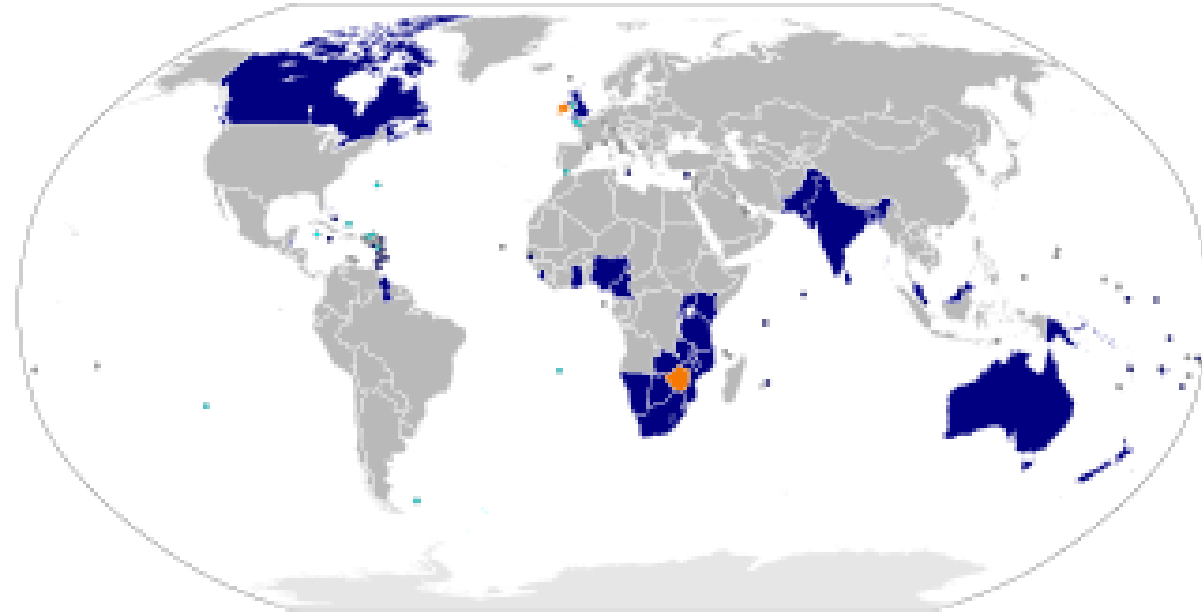


Commonwealth 'Tribute to Life' MOU

Member Countries

- 54 countries
 - Commonwealth Population: 2,421,898,000
 - Populations range from 10,000 (Nauru) to 1.3 billion (India)
 - 32 classified as small states (countries with a population under 1.5 million people (26), plus larger countries that face similar issues).
- All members have an equal say.

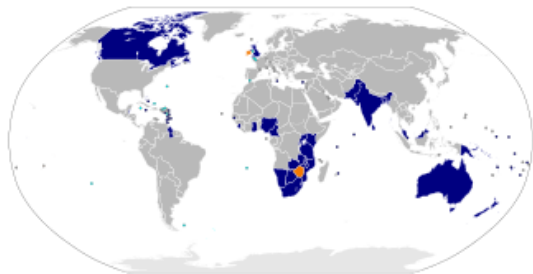

3. share training material

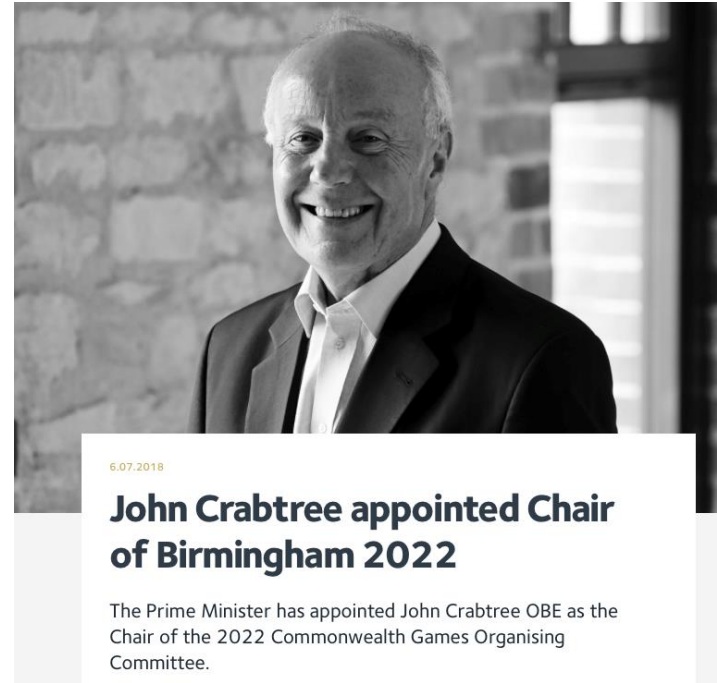




Gold Ambition
