Blood Donor Demographics 2019 (Whole blood donors only)

Northern Ireland

- 29 920 donors
- 43 367 donations
 - > 10.8% from new donors
 - > 89.2% from repeat donors

Scotland

- 94 609 donors
- 145 702 donations
 - > 8.6% from new donors
 - > 91.8% from repeat donors

Wales

- 57 871 donors
- 89 258 donations

England

- 825 363 donors
- 1 504 494 donations
 - > 9.4% from new donors
 - 90.6 % from repeat donors

Age and sex of donors, England

- In 2019 43.1% of donors in England were male (41.8% in 2018)
- More male donors are needed because:
 - o they can donate more often than women
 - o they have higher iron levels
 - o only men's blood can be used for some transfusions and products

Ethnicity and donors, England

More black and Asian donors are needed to match to patients requiring frequent transfusions. The number and percentage of black donors are increasing. In 2019, 1% of whole blood donors in England were black and 3% were Asian.

New donors, England

- > NHSBT need nearly 400 new donors a day to meet demand
- > 59% of new donors in 2019 were under the age of 35
- > 17% of donors were new donors and of these new donors:
 - o 59.4% were female
 - o 40.6 were male
