Message from OTDT Medical Director Professor John Forsythe


Dear Colleague,

COVID- 19 activity summary


The Clinical Team reviewed the latest COVID-19 activity data. While there has been a slight drop in numbers, we are still approaching pre-pandemic levels. The team will continue to look at the data and ensure we share the most up to date guidance to continue in the facilitation of donation and transplantation wherever possible.



Changes to OTDT Medical Team Structure

Many of you will have received communication cascaded via the Advisory Groups with regards to some important changes to the OTDT Medical Team structure.

The directorate of Organ and Tissue Donation and Transplantation (OTDT) announced changes to its target operating model in November 2020. These changes have afforded me the opportunity to review the OTDT Medical Team Structure. From April 2021, three of the current OTDT Medical Team roles will be converted to Associate Medical Director (UK) roles and include the following:



In addition, you will note another 2 posts, an Associate Medical Director – Transplant Medicine role, currently advertised via NHS Jobs. Lisa Burnapp is also included within the revised structure and I anticipate that she will take up her post in continuing to lead Living donation. Once all Associate Medical Directors are in post my intention is to share the detail of individuals' roles and responsibilities.
