

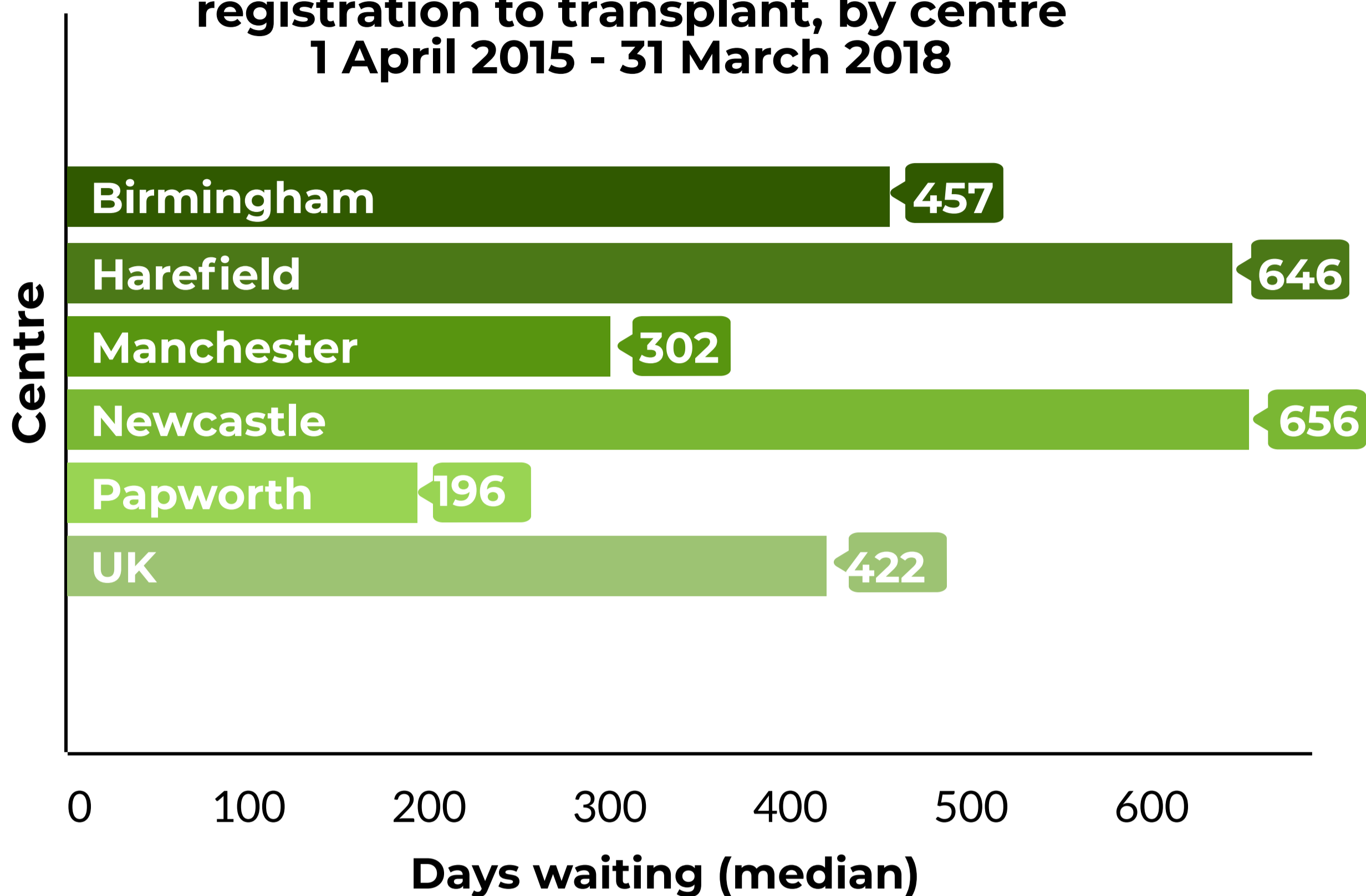

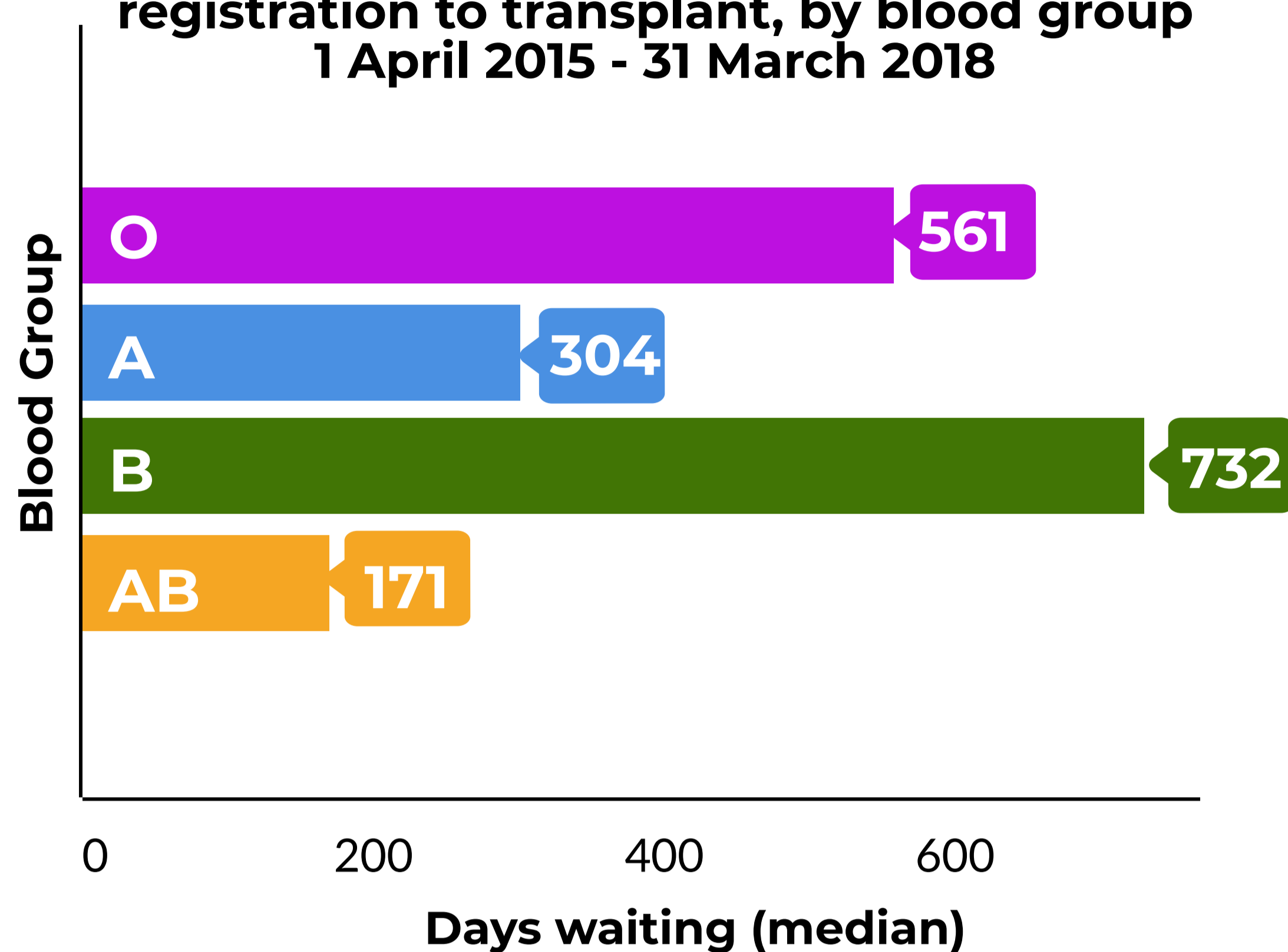


How long do people wait for a lung transplant?

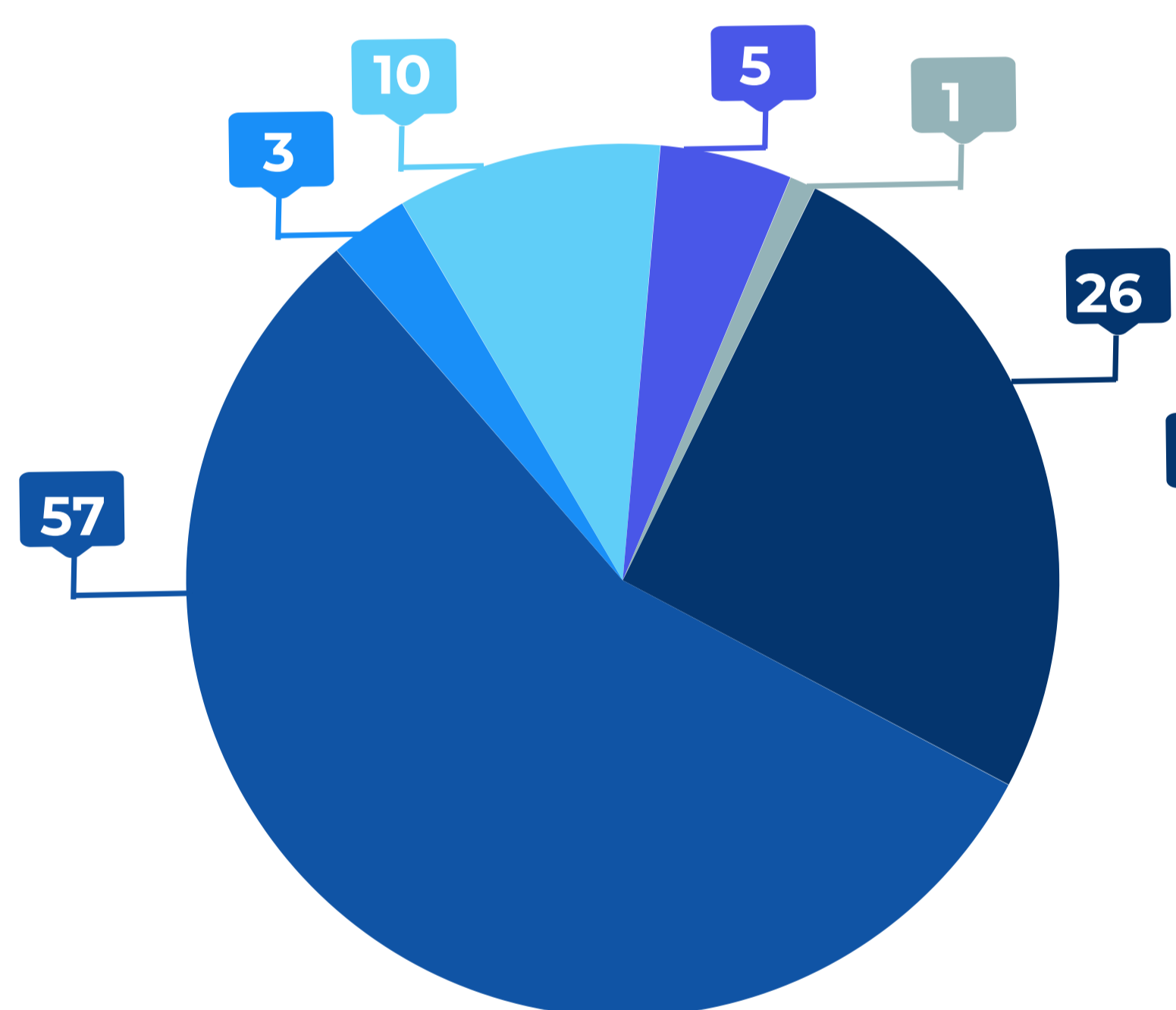
Estimated time from non-urgent registration to transplant, by centre
1 April 2015 - 31 March 2018



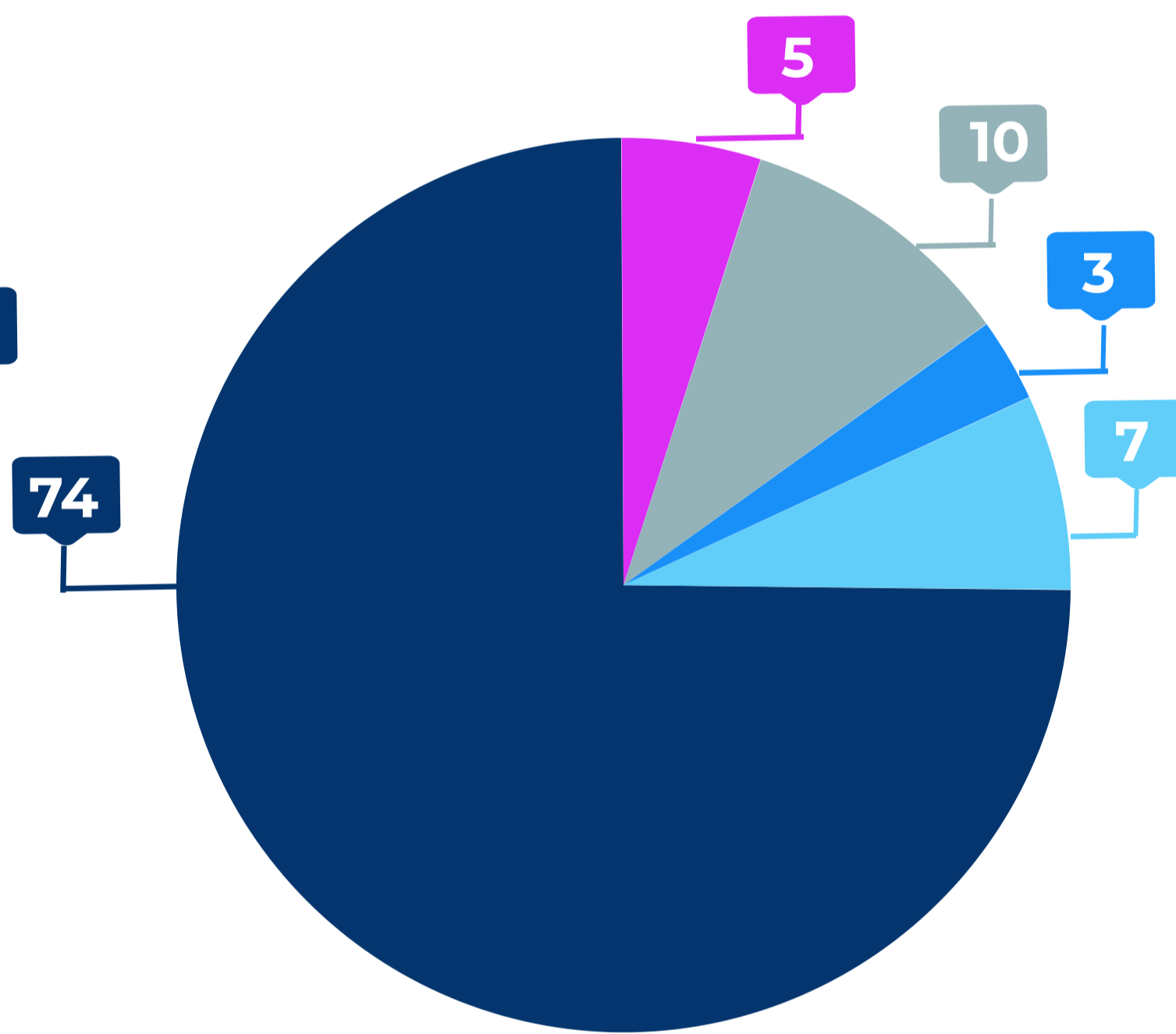
Estimated time from non-urgent registration to transplant, by blood group

Nationally, 6 months after going on the urgent list

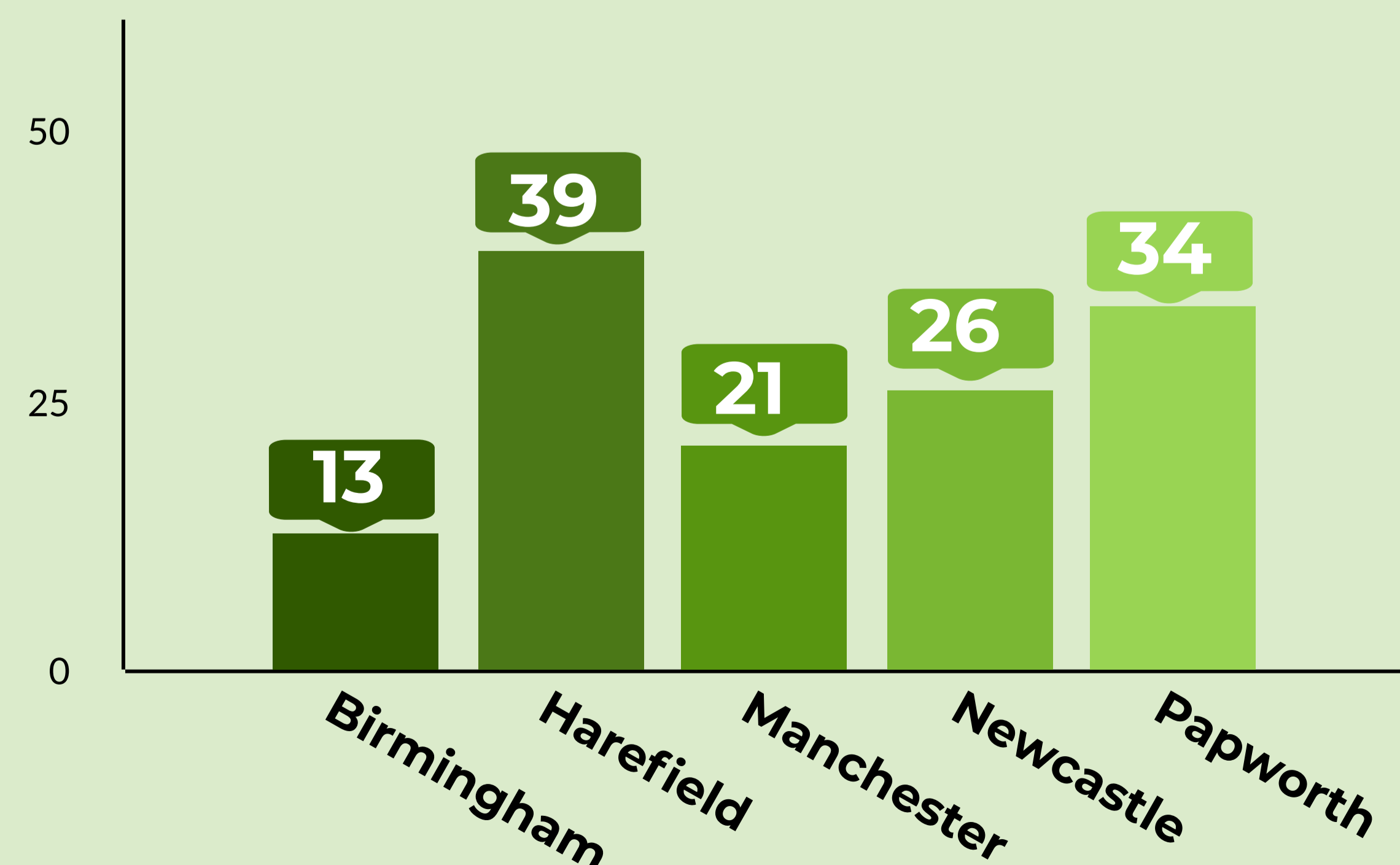


The median is a type of average and is the time when half of patients have received a transplant

Lots of things affect how long you might wait, including your blood group, presence of antibodies and the availability of the right size organs

- % transplanted
- % still waiting
- % removed from the list
- % who became urgent
- % who became non-urgent
- % died waiting
- % who became super-urgent

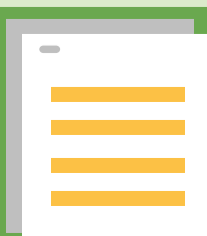
Average number of transplants per year between 1 April 2017 - 31 March 2020



What are the chances of a person surviving for one year after transplant?

On average, **81 out of 100** adult patients are alive after one year following a lung transplant
