- 2 The 2015/16 Annual Organ Donation and Transplantation Activity Report has been published, showing a record breaking year for deceased donors and deceased donor transplants. - 3 The third Annual Report on Pancreas Transplantation was published by NHSBT in July 2016, presenting data from the last 10 years on patients on the transplant list, number of transplants and survival after transplantation. CURRENT AND FUTURE WORK

- 5 An interim Report on Pancreas and Islet Transplantation between April and September 2016 is in progress and will be published later this year.
- 6 A prospective data collection for the Post Islet Transplant Sensitisation Study is on-going. Data collection will be reviewed by the PAG Islet Steering Group.
- 7 We continue to monitor the National Pancreas Allocation Scheme to make sure that no patient groups are being disadvantaged.
- 8 Work will be on-going to support three of the four working groups introduced by PAG; Organ allocation, Organ utilisation and damage, Donor and Recipient Risk Analysis.
