

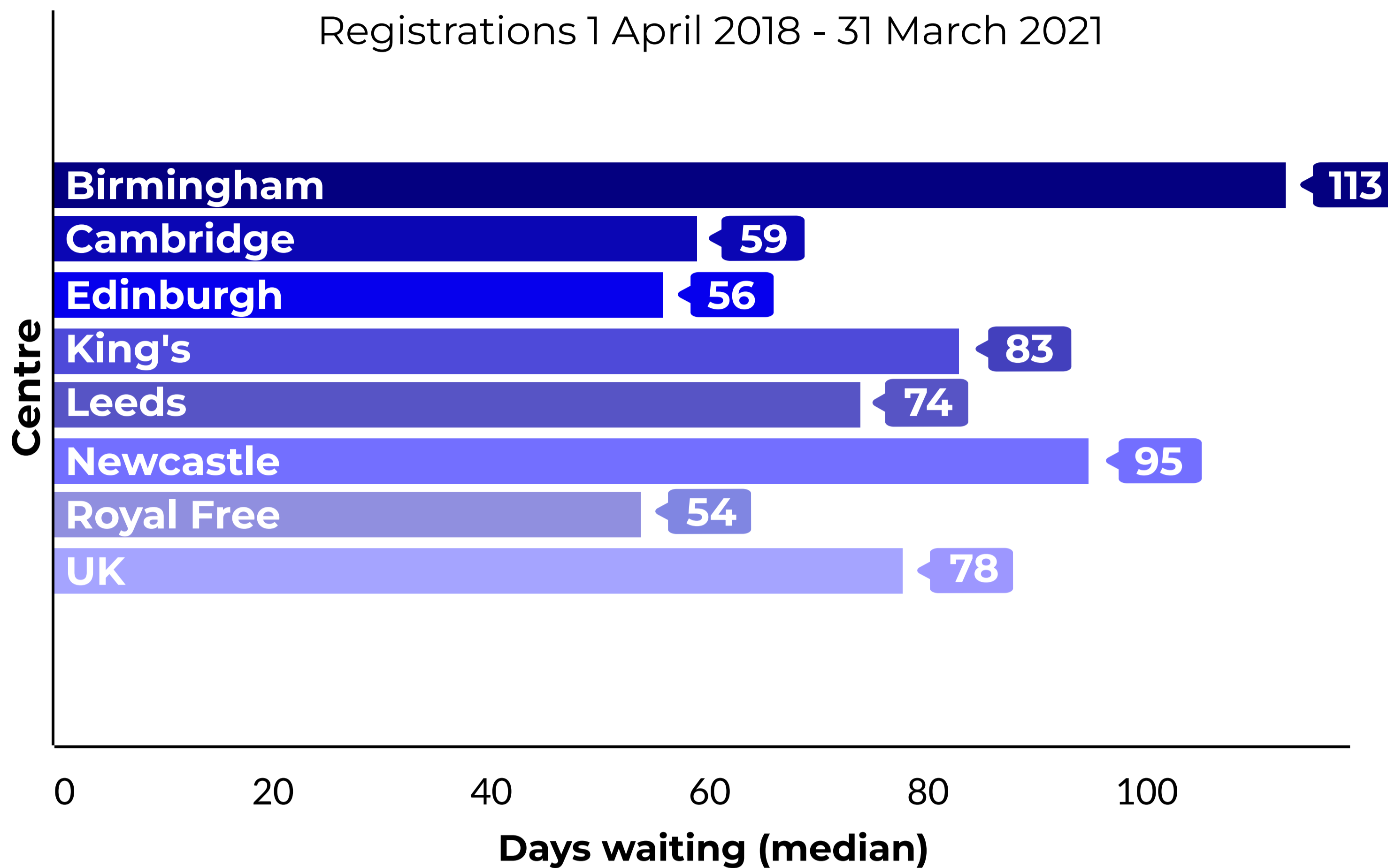


ADULT LIVER TRANSPLANTS (ELECTIVE PATIENTS)



How long do people wait for a liver transplant?

Registrations 1 April 2018 - 31 March 2021

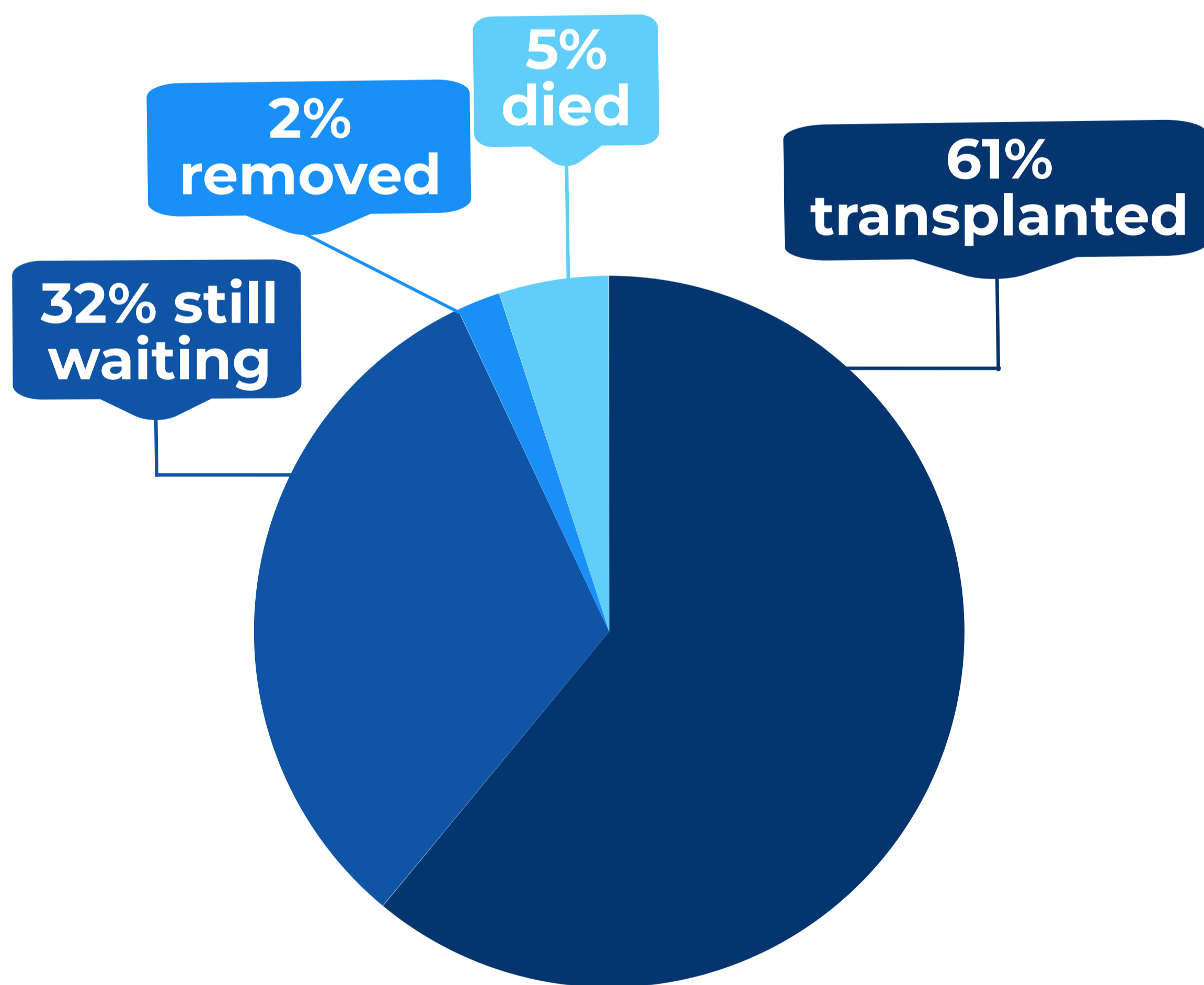


The median is a type of average and is the time when half of patients have received a transplant

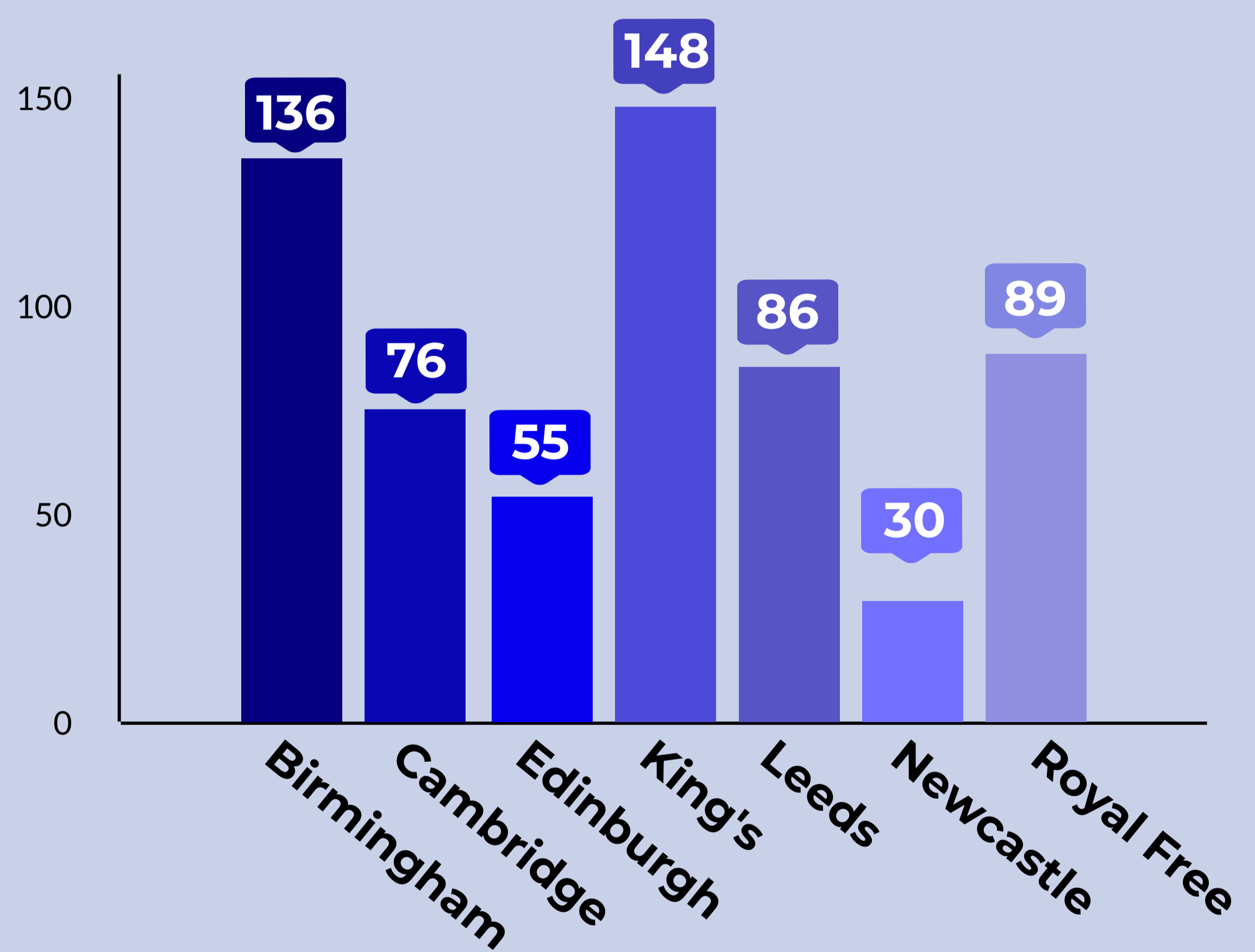
The waiting times shown are based on the new National Liver Offering Scheme which was implemented on the 20th March 2018

Lots of things affect how long you might wait, including your blood group, your type of liver disease and the availability of the right size organs

Nationally, 6 months after going on the elective list



Average number of transplants per year between 1 April 2019 - 31 March 2022



What are the chances of a person surviving for one year after transplant?

On average, **95 out of 100** adult patients are alive after one year following elective liver transplant

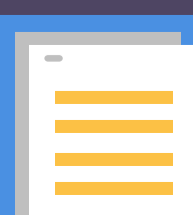
One year survival rate



What are the chances of a person surviving for five years after transplant?

On average, **84 out of 100** adult patients are alive after five years following elective liver transplant

Five year survival rate
