Needs to be a long term solution to link the prescriber and pathology requestor

What the working group recommend?

CTAG write to NHSE + other commissioners to state the long term clinical need for a national pathology requesting and reporting system

Some centres were asking patients to send blood samples in non compliant packaging

What the working group recommend?

All centres must supply packaging compliant with UN3373

Some transplant centres expect patients to pay for postage of samples

What the working group recommend?

All centres must provide pre paid postage and packaging

Some patients are travelling extreme distances to their transplant centre for blood tests

What the working group recommend?

Centres must organise blood tests local to the patient

Lack of clarity, support and guidance around devolved pathology requesting

What the working group recommend?

CTAG develop a national shared monitoring agreement. Pre agreed with local clinician before shared monitoring commences.

Processes for ensuring patients are having blood tests in line with clinical need are not robust

What the working group recommend?

Robust, regularly audited processes, must be implemented by all services

Patients like the self administered capillary immunosuppressant blood tests

What the working group recommend?

All centres should explore development of this service

Centres (and patients) are wasting hours chasing local blood test results

What the working group recommend?

Several tools exist which would significantly save time for transplant services

Patients would like positive results reporting

What the working group recommend?

Positive reporting processes are implemented (could be technology enabled)

Summary

- Working Group witnessed inefficient processes and systems which lacked rigour
- Many patients described poor experiences
- CTAG requested to approve report and recommendations
- Oversee and audit implementation
