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
The team from DSAA recruited their first patient for SWiFT shortly after opening. Amazing work!

### **Query Corner**

What happens to the data entry if a participant is transferred to a different hospital?



For every patient transfer, please contact the SWiFT trial team and include:

- the participant's randomisation number
- name of the hospital the participant has been transferred to
- date of transfer.


If the participant has been transferred to another participating site:

- We will provide the new site's team contact details and you will need to contact them to aid
  in identifying the participant (do not copy the SWiFT trial team into any correspondence
  containing PID).
- Ensure all your data entry is complete up until date of transfer and there are no outstanding queries for the participant.
- The participant record will be transferred to the new site in OpenClinica and you will not be able to see the record anymore at your site level.

For participants transferred to non-participating sites, the SWiFT trial team will advise on a case-by-case basis.



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## Query Corner

One of the SWiFT trial box labels (= R Numbers) has been used twice - what should we do?



<u>Action</u>: Inform the CTU trial team as soon as possible (include R number, key dates and products transfused). Transfusion labs: Please ensure the used R number label is marked as used / crossed through and taken out of circulation.

#### Prevention:

- HEMS: Strike through label on box once a trial box has been opened (regardless of whether products used or not).
- TF labs: use a checklist to ensure used R numbers are removed from circulation.

# Implementation Study: Your help needed on the 11th Sep 2023!

Our team is excited to begin the implementation study as part of the SWiFT trial. A series of process mapping focus groups and interviews will be carried out with healthcare professionals involved across all stages of the WB pathway as well as patients and blood donor representatives.

The process mapping focus group will allow us to gain an in-depth understanding of consolidating the "As-is" and "To-be" process maps and explore any adaptations needed across sites.

The interviews will be held with operational staff from the WB pathway and will enable us to understand their perspectives regarding the acceptability and the impact the intervention has on the current system and practices in which they work.

We are looking forward to commencing this series of activities and would like to invite and encourage you to join them.

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### Data Management: Tips

We have asked Nikki from our Data Management Team for her top tips how sites can help reduce the amount of queries they receive from our DM Team. Here are Nikki's top 3 tips for sites to reduce the numbers of queries they receive:



- Please do not raise queries in OpenClinica. If any additional information is required, or any questions you would like to ask about the data, please add as annotations only.
- Please do not leave any data fields blank. If a question can't be answered, or the information is unknown, please leave an annotation. Otherwise you will receive unnecessary data queries.
- If you respond to a query with the updated information, please update the data field as well. Data Management are not allowed to update data as part of EDC trials.


In my spare time I enjoy watching and playing football, and finding the balance between my loves of food and running.

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




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SWiFT Participating Sites Map
