


# **South West Organ Donation Services Team**

### **Donor outcomes**


Between 1 April 2015 and 31 March 2016, your Team had 110 deceased solid organ donors, resulting in 278 patients receiving a transplant. Further details are provided in the table and chart below. ## Radar charts of key rates, 1 April 2015 to 31 March 2016



The blue shaded area represents your Team's rates for 2015/16. The latest UK rates and your Team's rates for the equivalent period in the previous year are superimposed for comparison. The fuller the blue shaded area the better. The colour of the rate label on each of the radar charts indicates you Team's performance as shown in the appropriate funnel plot (included in the detailed report) using the gold, silver, bronze, amber, and red (GoSBAR) scheme. Additionally, the funnel plots in the detailed report can be used to identify the maximum rates currently being achieved by Teams with similar donor potential.

### Key numbers and rates

There are nine measures on the Potential Donor Audit (PDA) which are most likely to affect the conversion of potential donors into actual donors. A comparison against funnel plot boundaries has been applied by highlighting the key rates for your Team as gold, silver, bronze, amber, or red. Funnel plots can be found in the detailed report. Between 1 April 2015 and 31 March 2016, your Team met a statistically acceptable level in 8 of these measures. Of the 122 potential DBD donors with suspected neurological death, 62 proceeded to donation and 60 did not proceed. Of the 244 eligible DCD donors, 43 proceeded to donation and 201 did not proceed. Further details are provided below. Caution should be applied when interpreting percentages based on small numbers.
