Organ Donation and Transplantation 2030: Meeting the Need

In 2022/23, from 233 consented donors the Eastern Organ Donation Services Team facilitated 154 actual solid organ donors resulting in 379 patients receiving a life-saving or life-changing transplant. Data obtained from the UK Transplant Registry.

In addition to the 154 proceeding donors there were 79 consented donors that did not proceed.


Best quality of care in organ donation

Referral of potential deceased organ donors

Goal: Every patient who meets the referral criteria should be identified and referred to NHS Blood and Transplant's Organ Donation Service

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold



894 potential organ donors were referred to the team during 2022/23. There were 105 occasions where potential organ donors were not referred.




Presence of Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation

Goal: A Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation (SNOD) should be present during every organ donation discussion with families

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold



A SNOD was present for 324 organ donation discussions with families during 2022/23. There were 37 occasions where a SNOD was not present.

² DBD - Death confirmed by neurological tests and no absolute contraindications to solid organ donation

DCD - Imminent death anticipated and treatment withdrawn with no absolute contraindications to solid organ donation
