



### Flow of paediatric patients through the donation pathway (PDA data)








#### Age distribution, April 2022 – March 2023








#### Audited deaths by hospital, April 2022 – March 2023








### Number of neurological death tested/not tested patients by hospital, April 2022 – March 2023








### Reason why neurological death tests were not performed, April 2022 – March 2023








#### Neurological death tests performed by age, April 2022 – March 2023








### Eligible donors by hospital, April 2022 – March 2023








### Eligible donors by hospital and whether the family were approached, April 2022 – March 2023








## Reason families of eligible donors were not approached, April 2022 – March 2023








## Medically suitable eligible donors by hospital and whether the family were approached, April 2022 – March 2023








## Reason families of medically suitable eligible donors were not approached, April 2022 – March 2023








## Number of approaches where a SNOD was present/not present by hospital, April 2022 – March 2023



**National:** A SNOD was present in 72 approaches and not present in 21



## Number of families consented/authorised organ donation by hospital, April 2022 – March 2023








### Reason families of eligible donors did not support organ donation, April 2022 – March 2023






- Patient had registered a decision to Opt Out
- Patient had previously expressed a wish not to donate
- Family were not sure whether the patient would have agreed to donation
- Family did not believe in donation
- Family felt it was against their religious/cultural beliefs
- Family felt the patient had suffered enough
- Family did not want surgery to the body
- Family wanted to stay with the patient after death
- Family had difficulty understanding/accepting neurological testing
- Family felt the length of time for donation process was too long
- Family believe patient's treatment may have been limited to facilitate organ donation
- Family felt the body needs to be buried whole (unrelated to religious or cultural reasons)
- Strong refusal probing not appropriate
- Other



## Number of proceeding/non-proceeding donors by hospital, April 2022 – March 2023








# Reason eligible donors whose families consented/authorised organ donation did not proceed to organ donation, April 2022 – March 2023








### Transplants from proceeding donors by hospital, April 2022 – March 2023








