This session will demonstrate the process of DBD abdominal and cardiothoracic retrieval. In order to maximise learning time, bespoke video material has been shot in advance by the faculty, during a cadaveric retrieval. It will commence with preparatory steps, followed by key operative steps common to major trauma surgery and organ retrieval, then show organ retrieval surgery, the need for communication, team interactions and demonstrating the surgical steps in detail.
