SUMMARY FROM STATISTICS AND CLINICAL RESEARCH

INTRODUCTION

- 1 This paper provides an update from Statistics and Clinical Research and summarises current and future work in the area of multi-visceral and composite tissue transplantation.

UPDATE FROM STATISTICS AND CLINICAL RESEARCH

- 2 New and updated reports, all Advisory Group papers and conference presentations continue to be posted on the OTDT Clinical Site www.odt.nhs.uk.
- 3 A new NHS England funded clinical fellow, Rebeka Jenkins, started working with the team in January 2023 for 3 years. Rebeka's work will be focused on PREMS and will mostly be working with the BTRU. Her work will cover all organs and age groups, and will be done over 3 stages – an initial literature review on what is currently available in PREMS, moving to then focus on kidney implementation (due to her renal background) whilst ensuring the work is transferable to other organs, and finally looking at dissemination to patients. She will be making contact with advisory groups in the coming future as her work progresses.
- 4 Please note our current arrangements for staff responsibilities in support of organs and tissues.

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RECENT AND FUTURE WORK

- 5 Data on the latest national activity and outcomes following intestinal transplantation were presented at the National Intestinal Transplant Symposium and were well received.
- 6 An interim solution for collecting more extensive intestinal data has been developed and is ready for use. Nominated contacts at each of the transplant centres are required.
- 7 The 2022/23 Organ and Tissue Donation and Transplantation Activity Report and the 2022/23 Annual Report on Intestine Transplantation are currently in production and will be available in the summer.
