GP Connect HTML

Allow users to view a patient summary from their GP record (read-only view):

- Medication
- Allergies
- Appointments
- Vaccinations
- Referrals
- Other key information

GP connect: HTML



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England only (99% GP practices in England enabled share records)

Patients that have GP record

Patients that have consented to their records being shared

Cannot be used for research

Organisation must remain compliant with clinical risk management standards

GP Connect pros

- **Saves time:** follow up of blood test results
- Most up to date information for all patients: background data or medication dose changes
- Highlights any concerns raised by GP
- Manage medication to optimise therapy remotely

GP Connect cons

- Basic
- Navigation is not intuitive and extraction of data is old fashioned
- Results only visible when GP received results have been saved to the record – different agreements with pathology departments
- Covers England only
- Not all patients consented

Summary:

Basic access to information, but saves time and assists in timely clinical decision making.
