

Regional BAME Leads in ODT

Overview

Each of the 12 regional organ donation service teams throughout the UK have appointed a BAME lead to focus on increasing the levels of consent from the BAME community. There are a number of reasons why this approach has been taken.

Firstly, by appointing a Specialist Nurse – Organ Donation (SNOD) from within the regional team they are able to utilise their knowledge of the region, the make up of its communities, their ties within the regional team and in the wider NHS/ Community to identify and implement local actions to increase levels of consent from within their communities.

Secondly, it is appreciated that each community will have different needs and concerns in relation to organ donation. By having a SNOD in each of the Organ Donation Service teams they are able to identify the specific requirements of their communities and coordinate any actions and events.

The third benefit of local BAME leads is that there is an opportunity for the development of the SNOD role, which can be recognised as part of individual annual personal development plans (PDP). The position does not have a specific job description as this allows the SNOD to be responsive to the requirements of their communities.

The BAME lead in each regional team act as the link and point of contact for NHSBT's communication department.
