

South Central Organ Donation Services Team

Taking Organ Transplantation to 2020

In 2020/21, from 131 consented donors the South Central Organ Donation Services Team facilitated 94 actual solid organ donors resulting in 232 patients receiving a life-saving or life-changing transplant. Data obtained from the UK Transplant Registry.

In addition to the 94 proceeding donors there were 37 consented donors that did not proceed.

Best quality of care in organ donation



Referral of potential deceased organ donors

Goal: Every patient who meets the referral criteria should be identified and referred to NHS Blood and Transplant's Organ Donation Service

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold




487 potential organ donors were referred to the team during 2020/21. There were 50 occasions where potential organ donors were not referred.



Presence of Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation

Goal: A Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation (SNOD) should be present during every organ donation discussion with families



Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold

A SNOD was present for 157 organ donation discussions with families during 2020/21. There were 12 occasions where a SNOD was not present.
