

South Wales Organ Donation Services Team

Taking Organ Transplantation to 2020

In 2020/21, from 49 consented donors the South Wales Organ Donation Services Team facilitated 33 actual solid organ donors resulting in 82 patients receiving a life-saving or life-changing transplant. Data obtained from the UK Transplant Registry.

In addition to the 33 proceeding donors there were 16 consented donors that did not proceed.

Best quality of care in organ donation



Referral of potential deceased organ donors

Goal: Every patient who meets the referral criteria should be identified and referred to NHS Blood and Transplant's Organ Donation Service

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold



163 potential organ donors were referred to the team during 2020/21. There were 15 occasions where potential organ donors were not referred.




Presence of Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation

Goal: A Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation (SNOD) should be present during every organ donation discussion with families

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold



A SNOD was present for 65 organ donation discussions with families during 2020/21. There were 9 occasions where a SNOD was not present.

DCD - A patient in whom imminent death is anticipated, ie a patient receiving assisted ventilation, a clinical decision to withdraw treatment has been made and death is anticipated within 4 hours

² DBD - Death confirmed by neurological tests and no absolute contraindications to solid organ donation

DCD - Imminent death anticipated and treatment withdrawn with no absolute contraindications to solid organ donation
