INTRODUCTION

- 1 This paper provides an update from Statistics and Clinical Studies and summarises recent presentations, publications, current and future work.

UPDATE FROM STATISTICS AND CLINICAL STUDIES

- 2 The Annual Report on Intestine Transplantation has been published by NHSBT for the first time. The report covers 10 years of intestine transplant data, from 1 April 2004. It presents information on patients on the transplant list, number of transplants and survival after transplantation on a national and centre-specific basis. - 3 Rachel Johnson will return to the Statistics & Clinical Studies Department as at March 2015, as Head of Organ Donation and Transplantation Services, after spending six months on secondment.

CURRENT AND FUTURE WORK

- 4 Work has been completed on the development of a statistical model to describe the survival of patients after intestinal transplantation while adjusting for factors known to influence survival (agenda item 7.2). This work will be presented at the British Transplant Society Conference in early March 2015 and submitted for presentation to ISBTS Argentina June 2015 (agenda item 13). Future work will model survival from listing.
- 5 Data analysis has been carried out to study the last 20 years of intestine transplant activity and outcomes. This work will be submitted for presentation to ISBTS Argentina June 2015 (agenda item 13).
- 6 Revision of policy for paediatric donation. A change request is being prepared to modify the National Bowel Allocation Scheme such that priority is given to the allocation of paediatric donors onto paediatric recipients ahead of any adult recipient.
- 7 Work is being carried out, in collaboration with Prof John Dark and Prof Darius Mirza, on reasons for non-use of small bowel donors.
