

## Donor contra-indications to organ donation

- Age >90 years
- HIV disease (not HIV infection; no AIDS defining illness)
- disseminated cancer (above and below the diaphragm)
- melanoma (except local melanoma treated >5years before donation)
- treated cancer within 3 years of donation (except non-melanoma skin cancer and in-situ cervical cancer)
- nvCJD and other neurodegenerative diseases associated with infectious agents

## Organ Specific Donor Contra-indications

### Small bowel

#### 1 Pre-existing gastrointestinal disease

eg inflammatory small bowel disease (Crohn's disease or other enteritis)

intestinal malabsorption (celiac disease or other causes of protracted diarrhea)

lymphangiectasia, intestinal lymphoma, intestinal angiomata, small bowel

diverticulosis, intestinal pseudo-obstruction

FAP and duodenal or papillary tumours

Other conditions necessitating administration of PN

#### 2. Known coeliac or mesenteric arterial insufficiency

#### 3. Non-heart beating donors
