

Eastern Organ Donation Services Team

Taking Organ Transplantation to 2020

In 2021/22, from 221 consented donors the Eastern Organ Donation Services Team facilitated 157 actual solid organ donors resulting in 362 patients receiving a life-saving or life-changing transplant. Data obtained from the UK Transplant Registry.

In addition to the 157 proceeding donors there were 64 consented donors that did not proceed.

Best quality of care in organ donation



Referral of potential deceased organ donors

Goal: Every patient who meets the referral criteria should be identified and referred to NHS Blood and Transplant's Organ Donation Service

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold



886 potential organ donors were referred to the team during 2021/22. There were 114 occasions where potential organ donors were not referred.




Presence of Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation

Goal: A Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation (SNOD) should be present during every organ donation discussion with families

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold



A SNOD was present for 306 organ donation discussions with families during 2021/22. There were 22 occasions where a SNOD was not present.

² DBD - Death confirmed by neurological tests and no absolute contraindications to solid organ donation

DCD - Imminent death anticipated and treatment withdrawn with no absolute contraindications to solid organ donation
