

# **South Wales Organ Donation Services Team**

## Taking Organ Transplantation to 2020

In 2021/22, from 60 consented donors the South Wales Organ Donation Services Team facilitated 42 actual solid organ donors resulting in 106 patients receiving a life-saving or life-changing transplant. Data obtained from the UK Transplant Registry.

In addition to the 42 proceeding donors there were 18 consented donors that did not proceed.

#### Best quality of care in organ donation



### Referral of potential deceased organ donors

Goal: Every patient who meets the referral criteria should be identified and referred to NHS Blood and Transplant's Organ Donation Service

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold



173 potential organ donors were referred to the team during 2021/22. There were 5 occasions where potential organ donors were not referred.




## **Presence of Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation**

Goal: A Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation (SNOD) should be present during every organ donation discussion with families

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold



A SNOD was present for 75 organ donation discussions with families during 2021/22. There were 13 occasions where a SNOD was not present.
