Organ Donation and Transplantation 2030: Meeting the Need

In 2023/24, from 74 consented donors the Northern Ireland Organ Donation Services Team facilitated 64 actual solid organ donors resulting in 168 patients receiving a life-saving or life-changing transplant. Data obtained from the UK Transplant Registry.

In addition to the 64 proceeding donors there were 10 consented donors that did not proceed.


Best quality of care in organ donation

Referral of potential deceased organ donors

Goal: Every patient who meets the referral criteria should be identified and referred to NHS Blood and Transplant's Organ Donation Service

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold




163 potential organ donors were referred to the team during 2023/24. There were 4 occasions where potential organ donors were not referred.



Presence of Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation

Goal: A Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation (SNOD) should be present during every organ donation discussion with families



Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold

A SNOD was present for 107 organ donation discussions with families during 2023/24. There were 3 occasions where a SNOD was not present.
