

South West Organ Donation Services Team

Organ Donation and Transplantation 2030: Meeting the Need

In 2023/24, from 179 consented donors the South West Organ Donation Services Team facilitated 142 actual solid organ donors resulting in 338 patients receiving a life-saving or life-changing transplant. Data obtained from the UK Transplant Registry.

In addition to the 142 proceeding donors there were 37 consented donors that did not proceed.


Best quality of care in organ donation

Referral of potential deceased organ donors

Goal: Every patient who meets the referral criteria should be identified and referred to NHS Blood and Transplant's Organ Donation Service

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold



350 potential organ donors were referred to the team during 2023/24. There were 15 occasions where potential organ donors were not referred.




Presence of Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation

Goal: A Specialist Nurse for Organ Donation (SNOD) should be present during every organ donation discussion with families

Aim: There should be no purple on the chart

Aim: The team (marked with a cross) should fall within Bronze, Silver, or Gold



A SNOD was present for 208 organ donation discussions with families during 2023/24. There were 12 occasions where a SNOD was not present.
