## **RECENT AND FUTURE WORK**

- 10. We are working with NHS England to support the Cardiothoracic Transplant Review. This involves sharing data from the UK Transplant Registry and advising on analysis.
- 11. In close collaboration with members of CTAG-Lung and the lung transplant community we are continuing to develop a proposal for a transplant benefit style patient-based non-urgent lung offering scheme. We are also in the process of coordinating updates to the urgent lung registration criteria.
- 12. Updates to the heart CUSUM monitoring to incorporate re-transplants, as agreed by CTAG-Heart in April 2024, are in development.
- 13. We continue to support the DCD Heart Oversight Group and associated groups with regular data monitoring reports.
- 14. We are working with the International Society for Heart and Lung Transplantation to re-establish data sharing between the UK and the international cardiothoracic transplant registry.
- 15. We are working with clinicians in Newcastle on a review of heart-lung transplantation in the UK, looking at historical and present perspectives.
