Blood Stocks Management's (BSMS) VANESA data entry recommendations for hospitals

From September 2025

We are updating the recommended minimum data entry into VANESA, our data management system, to improve our understanding of stock levels and enhance reporting back to scheme participants.

The recommendations are:

- red cell stock entries increase from 15 to 20 per month
- wastage entries remain at one per month for red cells and platelets and are now also recommended at one per month for FFP and cryoprecipitate

Therapeutic Apheresis Services (TAS) will begin moving patient and donor care to a digitally-managed platform, TAS Connect from mid November 2025

TAS Connect has been designed and tested to:

- streamline and standardise the referral processes
- support clinical visibility across therapeutic apheresis services teams
- enhance data quality and oversight

The process of moving to TAS Connect will be carefully managed through a prescriptive, staged roll-out. This will begin with Plasma Exchange referrals only.

All other procedure referrals will continue in the paper format for now and will be introduced and rolled out in the near future. Staff in the TAS units you work with will know when this is happening and will be fully prepared. We will send email notifications to teams who refer into TAS, with information to support the TAS Connect referral process.

Updated SaBTO guidelines on patient consent and shared decision-making for blood transfusion are now published on the Wiley online library

The 2025 updated guidelines from the expert advisory committee on the Safety of Blood, Tissues and Organs (SaBTO) on patient consent and shared decision-making for blood transfusion are available on the <u>British Journal of Haematology's publication on the Wiley Online Library</u>. These guidelines supersede the 2020 recommendations.

Field Safety Notice issued in relation to agents used for HLA B27 testing FSN 2025-05_FastQ B27

Further to the communication issued to transfusion laboratory managers on 9 September regarding the <u>supplier field safety notice (PDF 132KB)</u>

We have completed retesting patients where an original blood sample was available and to date all results issued have been correct. However in some cases where a sample is no

longer available for testing it may be necessary to rebleed patients. If we require a second sample from your patients, you will be notified in writing.

In the unlikely event that the patient tests positive, a new report will be issued in Sp-ICE when retesting is complete.

You will not be charged for the retest.

We are continuing to test new patient referrals by an alternative method, but there may be a short delay in turnaround time for HLA B27 testing in the coming weeks until the supplier resolves the problem.

While this problem is ongoing the report format will be slightly different from your usual B27 report, however it will clearly state whether the patient has tested positive or negative.
