

Update on elfh eLearning transfer to NHS learning hub/zone

Dear Colleague,

NHS England have notified us (29th October) that the NHSBT eLearning modules (including the Blood Transfusion Training programme) on the elfh learning platform will not be transferred onto the NHS learning hub/zone until November 2025. NHS England are still unable to provide a specific date but have assured us that they will give us two weeks advance notice.

Once the two-week notification is received, from NHS England, we will inform you as soon as possible. We appreciate that it may be necessary for you to recommence staff transfusion training in the intervening period, but please remember that all module progress and historical data will be lost during the transfer. Therefore, you will need to download completion data from the Tableau reporting dashboard and advise staff to complete any training underway and download/print certificates before the transfer date.

Details of how to access and search the new platform, following the transfer, will be provided in due course.

Note: Organisations that use AICC access via their own learning management system or the Electronic Staff Record (ESR) platform will not be affected. eIntegrity users will be informed directly if and when their access will be disrupted.

What happens next?

We are advising you of this change in timescales so that you can make any necessary adjustments to your plans to minimise disruption to your education programmes.

We would recommend that you take the following actions:

- 1. Download any completion data required from Tableau prior to the transfer date. Contact NHSE TEL elfh Support for advice and guidance on using the Tableau reporting dashboard.
- 2. Advise staff to complete any training in progress before the transfer date.
- 3. Advise staff to download/print certificates/evidence of completion.
- 4. Advise staff not to undertake any eLearning during the transfer period. NHSE have not provided details of long it will take to complete.
