

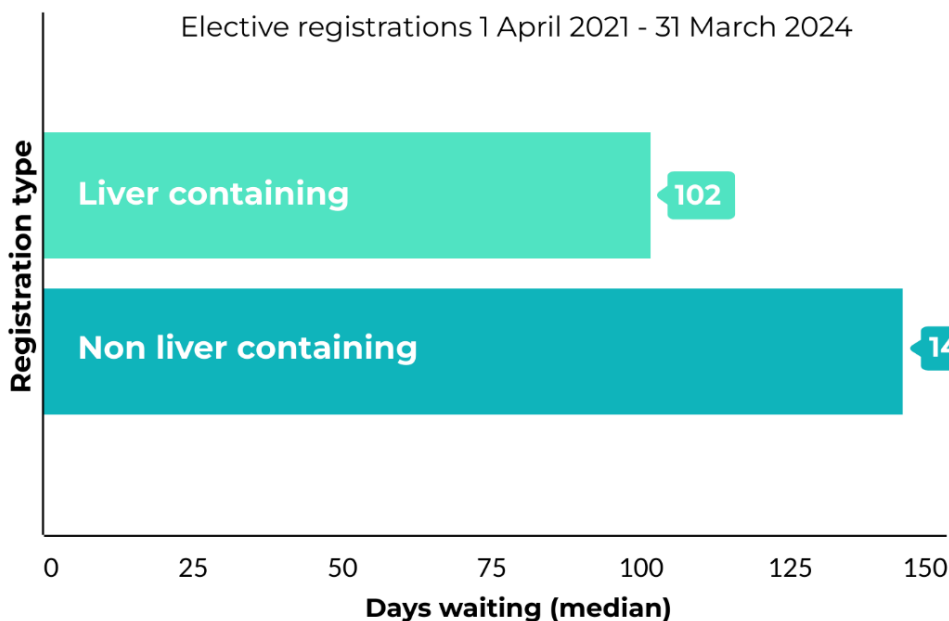


ADULT INTESTINAL TRANSPLANTS



How long do adults wait for an elective intestine transplant?

Elective registrations 1 April 2021 - 31 March 2024

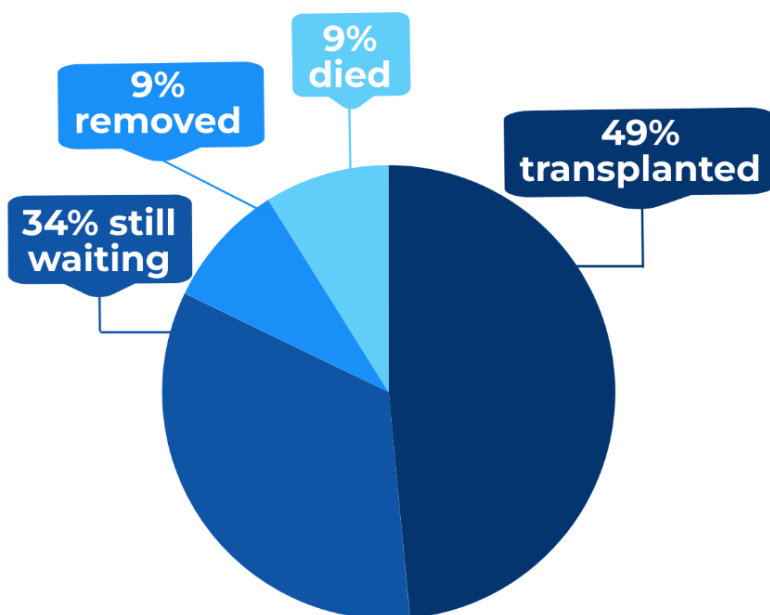


The median is a type of average and is the time when half of patients have received a transplant

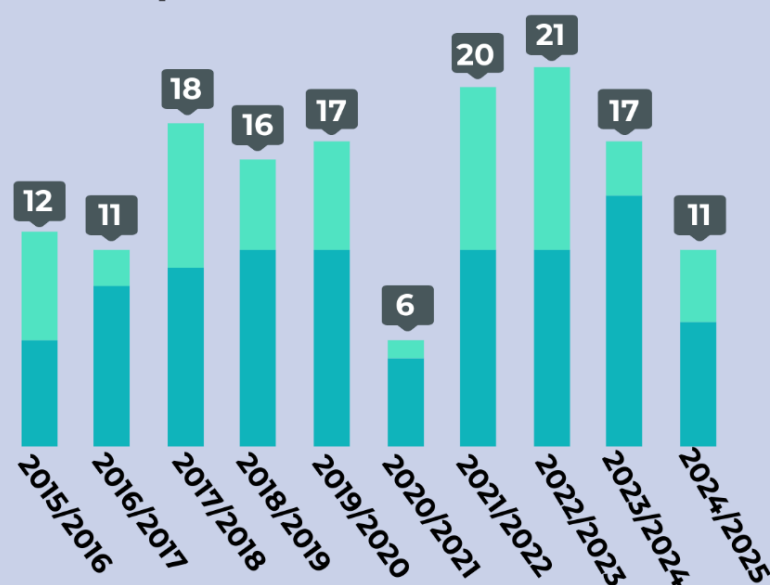
Overall median waiting time to intestine transplant for registrations between 1 April 2021 and 31 March 2024 was 133 days, or 4 months.

Lots of things affect how long you might wait, including your blood group, sensitisation and the availability of the right size organs

Nationally, 6 months after going on the elective list



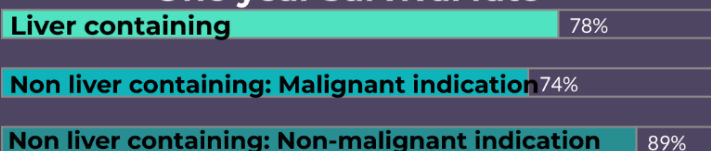
Overall number of transplants per year between 1 April 2015 - 31 March 2025



What are the chances of surviving for one year after transplant?

On average, **78 out of 100** patients are alive one year after an elective intestinal transplant with a liver. For non-liver transplants, survival rates are **74 out of 100** for malignant cases and **89 out of 100** for non-malignant cases.

One year survival rate



What are the chances of surviving for five years after transplant?

On average, **52 out of 100** patients are alive five years after an elective intestinal transplant with a liver. For non-liver transplants, survival rates are **40 out of 100** for malignant cases and **79 out of 100** for non-malignant cases.
