Organ Donation Week 2025: NHS Staff Engagement via ODCs QR Code initiative for Trusts/Health Boards

Results from the first NHS-wide activation via ODCs during Organ Donation Week, empowering NHS Trusts and Health Boards to champion organ donation.

NHS trusts and Health Boards empowered to support organ donation

What we did

• A new campaign saw Organ Donation Committees (ODCs) across the devolved nations collaborate with NHSBT to roll out Organ Donation communications to all NHS Trusts and Health Boards UK-wide, empowering staff to record their decision on the Organ Donor Register (ODR) and marking the biggest internal staff campaign ever held for Organ Donation Week.

What we delivered:

- Organ Donation Toolkit with key messaging and signposting to maximise campaign support.
- Partnered with the ODR team to provide bespoke tracking links and QR codes for 154 trusts and health boards across England, Wales and Northern Ireland.
- Boosted engagement through regional ODC webinars, driving grassroots involvement.
- 1.7 million staff reach, resulting in 1,087 registrations, of which 197 were new organ registrations.

For NHSBT This Means

- A new, credible channel to engage NHS trusts in organ donation conversations.
- Increased advocacy from NHS staff who are personally registered donors.
- Strong foundations for a sustained, year-round campaign with major employers and public sector partners.




Overview of all Regions - Opt-in registrations




South Central - Opt-in registrations




Northern - Opt-in registrations




Yorkshire - Opt-in registrations




Midlands - Opt-in registrations




Eastern - Opt-in registrations








