#### Tell your family campaign

In the first financial year, 2016-17, since the deemed consent system was introduced there were 21 cases where families have either overridden their relatives' decision on the organ donor register, or not supported deemed consent.

The overrides/ not supported and consent rates suggest that our campaign message needs to change to ensure the role of the family is clearly defined when an individual has recorded an opt in decision on the organ donor register, or chooses to have their consent deemed.

The campaign will evolve to "Tell your family" widening its focus and proactively communicating the role of the family and why it is important for families to be aware of an organ donation decision.

### **Towards 2020 Organ Donation and Transplantation Conference**

This will include the impact evaluation report commissioned by Welsh Government, the qualitative research study by Bangor University on family attitudes, actions, decisions and experiences following implementation of deemed consent and the Human Transplantation Act (Wales) 2013 and NHS Blood and Transplant monitoring impact of deemed consent.

The conference will be opened by Health Secretary Vaughan Gething AM.
